

Rams versus Friars

Once again, Rhode Island State and Providence College meet at Cranston Stadium in what is fast becoming one of the most interesting colleges series in these parts. The Friars and Rams have faced each other at the close of their season, and at the beginning of a campaign, and, here, tonight, their try something new—facing each other in mid-season.

The rivals first met upon the gridiron in 1931, when the two battled each other at the Brown Stadium for the benefit of the Milk Fund. Not until three years later, however, did the two institutions renew relations, and they since have been meeting with each other in football, basketball and baseball.

Providence holds a 5-2 edge in the football series. The results of these gridiron clashes have been as follows:

Stadium Sallies

Thumb Nail Sketches

COACHING STAFF

COACH KEANEY—Been guiding State's football destinies and just about everything else athletic, since 1920. One of Bates' greatest gridiron and diamond heroes of all-time, his feats resembling fiction, but you can bet your last nickel that most of 'em are true. (Verily, how true!) Twenty-year record coaching here just below .500 mark, but largely due to lack of weight and numbers.

FRED TOOTELL—First came to State in 1925. Reputed to be greatest hammer thrower of alltime, and, currently, the nation's leading track coach, turns out champions with frequent regularity. Didn't get his sheepskin from Bowdoin until 1930—and then, by parcel post, insured. Played against Rhode Island in football, in 1921. Competed in as many as six track events, weighed much heavier than he is today. An Olympic champion.


BILL BECK, '24—Hero of 20-inning Brown-Providence College baseball game, driving out hit that settled the longest intercollegiate contest of all-time. Weighed about 135 pounds, but played virtually every position in football, and excelled, at that! Even kicked points after. Played against Tootell in Bowdoin-Rhode Island game of 20 years ago. Quite a skiier.

PAUL CIEURZO, '31—Alternated between line and backfield. Performed also in track and basketball. Played at Dean upon a football team, every member of which subsequently became a college captain, including All-American Frank Carideo, of Notre Dame fame. Made five letters in high school—football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis—has since added golf.


ACTING PRESIDENT JOHN BARLOW—Highly treasures picture of Middlebury's first football team, upon which he starred at guard, in 1893. Football his sole athletic specialty. Came to State in 1901, has been treasurer of the Athletic Association just about every year since, currently is chairmain of the Athletic Council.

PROF. MARSHALL H. TYLER—Twice rewarded by Amherst as the "greatest all-around athlete in college," has cups to vouch for it. Some termed him "All-American;" to get through his tackle post was as "easy" as crashing a stone wall. Often participated in baseball and track the same day, was New England intercollegiate high jump champion. At times kicked off and then made the tackle.




