To identifications in yesterday's letter add middle name: Thomas Foxhall Cutts. James Brown Thornton, b. Mar. 7, 1765, great grandson of Sarah Brown from whom he received other silver, handed the sauceboat on to "E. W. B." (another Brown?) May 31st 1848, as engraved on the opposite side. The cream pitcher mentioned in the same descent came to C.C.G.Thornton, great great grandson of Curtis & Eunice Scamman Cutts. Without looking up genealogy that may be available for reference, it appears that Curtis Cutts was likely a son of Thomas Foxhall and Elizabeth Cutts whose initials are the "E.C." on bottomoof the Loring creamer.
