The enclosed material will help make up for my missing your last visit.

Since the set of Revere spoons recorded in the Revere ^{Log} book came to your notice, I have looked up Cunningham genealogical reference for the identities or identity of the William Cunninghams whose period of patronage corresponds, there having been two, cousins, who lived 1746-1794, and 1742/3-1816, and each had a son William. The price for the spoons is as was understood when you indicated your interest, \$1,650.00.

Descriptions are attached to the other subjects. The Dixwell cup with or without the cover is \$825.00. As you have a Dixwell porringer you may find a companion piece by that early maker also desirable.

The Savage family piece with tooled maker's initials mark, is \$660.00. The oval cream jug by Loring is \$330.00.

The Winslow tankard with lip may be considered at \$2,475.00.

These pieces were held by my father with the exception of the Dixwell cup which I acquired two years ago.
