Thank you for your check which is very timely as we had planned on it.

Enclosed is a slip of paper which came with the Andrew mug, but its observations subject to the corrections noted.

I am sending along also the signed statement received with the Samuel Burt Creamer. Incidentally Savage's genealogy of families in New England before 1700 gives this name Reddington as in residence in the same town of Boxford.

Also the account of Thomas Savage as obtained by George C. Gebelein from Wm. C. Edwards of Quincy, Mass. (researcher for 1st Church). The reference to a caudle cup is that of the First Church, Quincy, by Thomas Savage, which is illustrated and described in the Colonial Dames "OLD SILVER OF AMERICAN CHURCHES", by E. Alfred Jones, p.394.

Incidentally, if you do not have a copy of that large volume, my father acquired an extra copy which we would sell. There is contained considerable lore on makers (with marks) and families of the donors. I am not sure what Goodspeed's price would be on a perfect copy, but I would price it \$90.00. I have an idea the book has sold up to \$150.00 or that such a price was contemplated. There was a printing of 506 copies and we have two in new condition, numbers 452 and 476.
