Thank you very much for your recent payment on account.

On the prospect of your swinging the Coburn tankard along with something further on the prior charges, the tankard being available for cash settlement on the extension of time obtained, I would promote a reduction from \$3025.00 to \$2750.00 for you to allot to the tankard. It is ready for your instructions. I think this is about right to get it for, although they are talking higher to bring out an example attractive to the collector nowadays, and it was supposed I should rate this one in the next thousand range.

As I review the last lot you are retaining, that Coburn sauceboat is certainly a well bought little prize, and as for the Waters cream jug, something comparable I believe it is by Joseph Moulton was mentioned to me lately for a higher figure which I was not inclined to follow up. As intimated in my previous I am only turning the tankard your way at a mere handling fee and the Federal excise over the procurement demand, that is, the cash figure proposed as minimum somewhat less than first mention to which I demurred.
