I will be glad to send on approval the Coburn
sauceboat along with the Samuel Waters cream jug
and Thomas Edwards rat-tail spoon.

With reference to Waters, we have associated him
with the classic period types that are linked to
the name of Revere, since we have in our shop safe
the remains of the tragic destruction by fire in
the descendants' aged house in Bedford, Mass. of
one of the engraved fluted urn covered sugar bowls,
the remnants of which include only partially melted
parts including the base bearing the mark S.WATERS.

Latest to come in is a porringer by the John the
Senior Burt, 1692/3-1745, full name JOHN

BURT on the
handle, price 990.00. Actually of course the
sauceboat is the rarer if not as early, and the
sauceboat could the more readily bring the four
figures that either piece could command with rela-
tively little Colonial silver now turning up to
satisfy interests who in an open opportunity would
be in a competitive buying situation.
