Maker's mark: D.Moseley script in rectangle.

Details: Double pine-cone acanthus finial, open scroll thumb-piece, plain oval shield tailpiece on handle.

The pepper caster by B. Burt 1729-1805 was engraved K B (Barrell, Charlestown and East Cambridge), descending in Joy family.
