325. SILVER PORRINGER BY JOHN DIXWELL Boston, 1680-1725
Convex-sided bowl of unusual depth, foliated cartouche handle, beautifully pierced in cinquefoil pattern and engraved on the face with the initials S.G. Reverse of handle stamped with maker's mark: J.D., Roman capitals in an oval. Very rare.

Height, 21/8 inches; diameter, 51/4 inches; length of handle, 25/8 inches

Note: John Dixwell, born in New Haven in 1680, was the son of 'Regicide' Colonel John Dixwell, a dramatic figure in New England history, who, fleeing from England, sought refuge in New Haven and lived there under the name of James Davis until his death in 1689.
