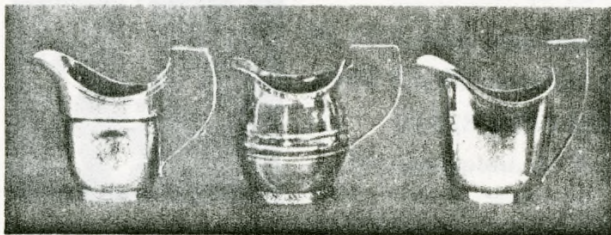
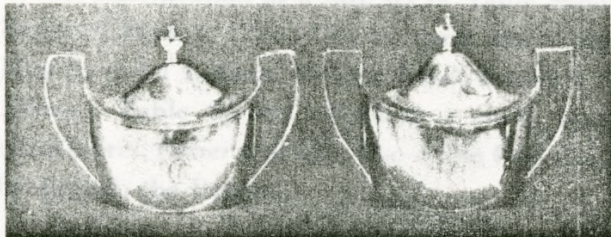


Early American Silver—representatives of

of the period immediately before and after 1800
in Newburyport and Boston, Massachusetts



Pair oval covered sugar bowls (below) and oval cream pitcher of matching style (right, above) by Ebenezer Moulton, born in Newburyport 1768, established in Boston 1795. Oval pitcher at left by Boston associate and elder craftsman Joseph Loring 1743-1815. In center, pitcher of round barrel shape with border of stars in the spirit of the birth of our national banner in 1812, by brother William Moulton, born 1772, of Newburyport.
