

Oval pitcher at left by Boston associate and elder craftsman Joseph Loring 1743–1815. In center, pitcher of round barrel shape with border of stars in the spirit of the birth of our national banner in 1812, by brother William Moulton, born 1772, of Newburyport.

Representing the work of makers of French descent in America, to be found in the GEBELEIN Collection of Colonial Silver, together with such other pieces of interest in this classification as a rare set of Table Spoons by Daniel Boyer of Boston, 1725-1779; an early 18th Century tapering Mug by John LeRoux of New York, Freeman 1723, later of Albany; Table Spoons affording a study in variations by the Reveres, father and son; also a fine Can and plain Beaker by Revere, the Patriot.

* Pelletreau, apprenticed to Simeon Soumain in New York City, 1741, was admitted Freeman, 1750, when he settled again in Southampton, became Captain of Militia, 1765, was in Simsbury and Saybrook, Conn., 1776-1782, returned to L. I. where son and grandson continued his business.
