CAN, Ht. 4 1/8", by JOHN LE ROUX, N. Y., Freeman 1723, later of Albany. Engraved early owners' initials of Van Sickle and Gunsevert families.

CASTER, Ht. 3 1/2", and SALT, Diam. 2 1/2", by SHEPHERD & BOYD, Albany, c. 1810. Engraved CVDB (Van Der Bogart family, Albany).

PORRINGER, large size specimen, Diam. 5 5/8", by ELIAS PELLETREAU, of Southampton, L. I., 1726-1810, Freeman 1750.

SHOE BUCKLES, 2 1/2" x 1 1/8" oval chased, silver with bronze tangs, by JACOB BOELEN, N. Y. 1659-1729, Freeman 1698.

SUGAR BOWL and COVER, Ht. 8 1/4", engraved and beaded classic type, by EPHRAIM BRASHER, N. Y. Dir. 1786, die-maker of the "Brasher Doubloon."
