

SILVER BEAUTIFUL — SUBSTANTIAL — PRACTICAL



*A*S fashioned by GEBELEIN in the manner of an original Colonial example, the Gravy Boat is of heavy silver "raised" by hand—an authentic duplicate of a rare model by Stephen Emery of Boston (1725-1801).

*T*HE Beaker of solid silver—essential to the proper service of many refreshments—is a GEBELEIN adaptation of its early type. Height $4\frac{1}{4}$ ", top diameter $3\frac{1}{4}$ ".

*T*HE Bowl (for mayonnaise, candy, etc.) measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ " across the top and slightly over 2" high. Saucer is of heavy silver and may be used for many purposes. Diameter 6".

A HOT Muffin Dish—no other than a large Colonial design porringer with cover—is one solution for the difficult choice of a major gift that is unusual. Diameter $5\frac{1}{2}$ "; over all measurement including scroll-pierced handle, about 8".
