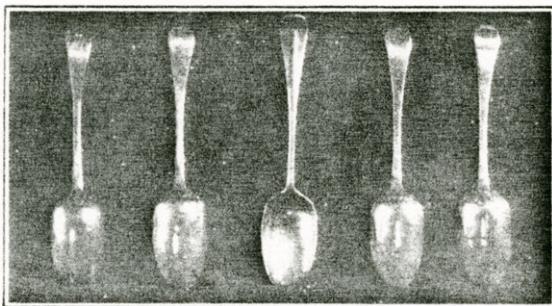

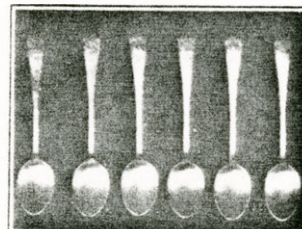
Rare Collection of Five early American table spoons by
the Boston silversmith Daniel Boyer, 1725-79



The son of James Boyer 1700-41, a Huguenot silversmith who came with the Sigourneys and Johannots from La Rochelle, France, and who married the daughter of Daniel Johannot. Daniel Boyer was clerk of the market 1754-58, 4th Sergeant of the Artillery Company in 1762, and a member of the Old South Church which he joined, 1770; he married Elizabeth, daughter of John Bulfinch, and two of his daughters married Joseph Coolidge Junior, 1747-1821, a silversmith, an ardent Son of Liberty and one of the "Boston Tea Party".
