Property part of Bradley Estate acquisition by Providence College—June 9, 1926  
Groundbreaking Ceremony—Sept. 19, 1946  
Opening—Feb., 1947?; later named for St. Antoninus, 15<sup>th</sup> century Archbishop of Florence, founder of Convent of San Marco, theologian, historian and economist

Construction—Sept. 19, 1946-Feb., 1947?; designed as temporary Business Administration Department Building, eventually to be turned over to Physical Plant; 159' x 54', one story, fireproof, cinder block building contained office space and Lab/Classrooms for 350 students

Walk to Harkins Hall construction—May, 1953; 1953 Class gift

Alumni Hall (Gymnasium) Walk (Alumni Hall [Gymnasium] to Donnelly Hall to Antoninus Hall [Business Administration Bldg.] ) construction—Apr., 1956; Contractor Campanella and Cardi Construction Co., Providence; Cost \$1,400; 1956 Class Gift

Renovations—Summer, 1956; included in Central Heat Plant Expansion

Renovations—1959; Cost \$14,989; facade finished with red brick

Walk to Harkins Hall demolition—1963? (Meagher Hall Construction)

Renovations—Summer, 1967; Architect Baker and Conlon, East Providence; Business Administration Department moved out, Psychology Department moved in; Labs and other offices moved into vacated space

roof repair—Summer, 1969; Cost \$8,400

Renovations—1970-1971; electrical service upgraded and new Psychology animal learning lab constructed;

Architect Halliwell Engineering Associates, East Providence; Cost \$33,000

Reopening—Mar. 21, 1988; Western Civilization Development Program completed  
Rededication as Cornelius C. Moore Hall—Oct. 22, 1988
