

P. C. PROFESSOR ENTERS ARMY

Rev. Edward P. Doyle, O. P., Takes Oath As Chaplain

Rev. Edward P. Doyle, O.P., professor of religion at Providence College, was sworn into the Army Chaplains' Corps on campus yesterday. Second Lieut. David A. Sawyer of the Army Specialized Training Program unit stationed at the College administered the oath of office in Aquinas Hall. Fr. Doyle, now a first lieutenant in the Army, reports to Chaplains' School, Harvard University, on September 26.

A native of Fall River, Mass., Fr. Doyle graduated from the B. M. C. Durfee high school in that city and entered Providence College in 1929. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree from Providence College in June, 1933, and entered the Dominican Order that August. He was ordained a priest in the Order of Preachers at St. Joseph's Priory, Somerset, Ohio, on May 17, 1939, by Most Rev. James J. Hartley, D.D., Bishop of Columbus.

Fr. Doyle received his Master of Arts degree from the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C., in 1941, and was appointed to Providence College in September of that year. He was moderator of the sophomore class at the College at the time of being granted a leave of absence to apply for an Army commission.
