Eisenhower knew that what he and his men saw in 1945 would be the only testimony many Americans would believe.

Thus it was that sergeants from Maine ... medics from Nebraska ... infantrymen from California ... and a general from Kansas became not only liberators of the Nazi camps, but the messengers of their horrors as well.

Now under construction less than 400 yards from the Washington Monument the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum will be one of the largest and most important Holocaust museums in the world when it opens in 1993.

Our Chairman, Elie Wiesel, will introduce an extraordinary film -"The Final Solution"--which will have its American premiere during this Evening. The documentary is being distributed by Arthur Cohn, producer of "The Garden of the Finzi-Continis."

The national civic commemoration in the Capitol Rotunda is a public ceremony for which no tickets are required. Tickets for the Evening of Commemoration will be issued without charge to those attending the Inaugural Assembly. For your convenience, we are enclosing registration information, which must be returned to the American Gathering.

We hope that you will be with us for these ceremonies in Washington on April 18 and in Philadelphia on April 21.
