has brought me two changes, one in rank and another in station. On the second of May I received a promotion to captain and the following day a change of station. Now attached to the 413th Infantry Regiment of the 104th Infantry Division, at Camp Carson, Colorado. Received ten days leave to visit my mother and arrived here in camp yesterday.

Found a grand reception here as it seems this regiment hasn't had a Catholic chaplain since last January. This is indeed a beautiful camp at the base of the Rockies and in sight of famed Fikes Peak. Whereas I had an APO number before Iam told this one has real significance---we shall see.
