Very Rev. and Dear Fr. Provincial:

It is over, over here--thank God. The ending was not dramatic but we could see each day the end of the German army and resistance. Yet this war has left its toll in human suffering and each day I witness the tragedy of war and untold human misery. The roads are filled with refugees, some barefooted making their way back to their native countries.

While this side is finished up the big question is what happens next. I am hoping at least for a brief sojourn in the states before I see China and vicinity--yet actually no one here knows..we will see. I shall keep you informed, Father Provincial. This war has been a great experience and now that it is all over am most proud I was in the infantry and in the midst of it all. The experience will enhance a teaching career. And I wish to thank you, Fr. Provincial for your gracious permission to enter the army. I am sure the Church has profited by the work of her chaplains and also the orders the men represented. There is no question as to where the Church was during combat..she was right there

I shall be most interested in the proceedings of the educational meeting at P.C. Will do all I can to learn in full the Army's guidance program and rehabilitation set-up the better to put it to use for Providence College.
