First it was combat in Belgium and Holland and for the past full seven months it has been Germany, , Aaachen, Duren, Colggne, Bonn, Halle and Leipzig.

Father Provincial we have nothing offis cial but according to the radio reports I may be home for a rest in 'uly or so, but having done such a fine job, say the general we will get a chance at the sons of heaven. Received the Bronze Star recently. As to the homecoming I will endeavor to keep you informed and assuredly call upon youmif

I have the opportunity.

Will be most anxious to hear of the proceedings of the educational meeting at Providence College. Cur division will not participate in the army educational program here in Europe so I was unable to secure the information I wanted about the army guidance set up but will do all I can to learn it when the opportunity is mine.

Expect tomorrow to look up the Dominican brethren here in Leipzig..am told there are but three of them here. Asking a kind re' membrance to allthe fathers and brothers.
