Your letter and the return of records concerning Brother George Holl were received. On Father Walsh's return last evening from a mission, I turned the matter over to him. We will wait your pleasure in the visitation and in the meanwhile hold up his Orders, if the Bishop takes a notion to come down for them.

My present writing, Very Reverend Father, is again in behalf of Brother Paul Doyle of Fall River, Mass. whom, you will recall, you permitted to go home over a year ago to see his mother before her committment to the State Asylum. Now she is in a critical physical condition with no chance of recovery, but with death likely at any time. When home, he received no recognition because she was in her worse condition mentally; but now there is a possibility of this, as treatment has brought to her lucid periods. Very Reverend Father, will you grant to this Novice the permission to spend a week with his mother before her condition is worse? He is in every way of character and standing in the community deserving.

I wish to report to you that the matter of retreats for Grand Rapids has been favorably adjusted, the community accommodating itself to me convenience. Likewise, that I open the retreat on Easter evening in Youngstown, as you assigned some months ago.

The above matters I leave entirely to your pleasure, hoping to hear from you. May I thank you for all your consideration in like matters in the past.
