

Chaplain Has Advice For Wives With GI Husbands Overseas

"I love you very much and miss you" is the message American wives and sweethearts will send their servicemen overseas often, if they heed the advice of an army chaplain here last Saturday.

The advice was sounded by the Rev. E. P. Doyle, O.P., chaplain to Catholic General Terry Allen's famous 104th "Timberwolves" Infantry on the western front, in a lecture to sixty novices at the Dominican House of Studies, River Forest.

Explaining "nobody can have any conception of what these boys at the front went thru," Father Doyle said the message would have a steadying effect among temptations which beset all occupying armies.

Chaplain Doyle, who also lauded Holland Catholics on their widespread practice of the family rosary, told his listeners of being invited to participate in the devotion in a Zundert, Holland, home where the Rosary and Litany of the Blessed Virgin were recited from memory by an eight-year-old girl, with three older daughters later singing "My Old Kentucky Home" for him in appreciation for his attendance.
