IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. FOGARTY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Military Affairs

A BILL

To provide for advancement in rank for certain World War veterans.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That (a) any person who served as a commissioned officer
4 in the land or naval forces of the United States during the
5 period between April 6, 1917, and November 11, 1918,
6 who is on the retired list, and who is serving on active duty
7 in the present war, shall be advanced to a commissioned
8 rank one grade higher than the rank held by him on the
9 date of the enactment of this Act.

10 (b) No person coming within the purview of this Act
11 shall be promoted to a higher rank than captain in the Navy
12 or Coast Guard nor colonel in the Marine Corps.


