Mr. FOGARTY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To implement and augment existing statutes, so as to increase the prevailing immigration quota for Greece.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That during the three fiscal years beginning with July 1,
4 1949, the Secretary of State is authorized and directed to
5 issue to persons from within Greece, and resident therein
6 at the time of application for a visa under the terms of this
7 Act, "nonquota" visas on which to migrate to the United
8 States: *Provided*, That no such visa shall be issued unless
9 the applicant therefor is admissible to the United States
10 under all the provisions of existing law other than those
11 provisions of section 3 of the Immigration Act of September

1 5, 1917, as amended (39 Stat. 875-878, 8 U. S. C. 136-
2 138), or any provisions of the Immigration Act (quota) of
3 May 26, 1924 (45 Stat. 153, 8 U. S. C. 201): *Provided*
4 *further*, That this Act shall in no manner whatsoever affect
5 the present quota laws which provide an annual quota of
6 three hundred and seven for Greece: *And provided further*,
7 That the number of "nonquota" visas authorized and directed
8 to be issued under this Act shall not exceed: For the fiscal
9 year ensuing the passage of this Act, the number of fifty
10 thousand. For each of the other and following fiscal years
11 herein referred to, five thousand.

A BILL

To implement and amend existing statutes so as to increase
the prevailing immigration quota for Greece.
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
That during the three fiscal years beginning with July 1,
1948, the Secretary of State is authorized and directed to

at the time of application for a visa under the terms of the
Act "nonquota" visas on which to migrate to the United
States: *Provided*, That no such visa shall be issued unless

under all the provisions of existing law other than those
provisions of section 3 of the Immigration Act of September

 2 138), or any provisions of the Immigration Act (quota) of
 3 May 26, 1914 (43 Stat. 153, 8 U. S. C. 201); *Provided*
 4 *further*, That this Act shall in no manner whatsoever affect
 5 the present quota laws which provide an annual quota of
 6 three hundred and seven for Greece; *And provided further*,
 7 That the number of "non-quota" visas authorized and directed
 8 to be issued under this Act shall not exceed, for the fiscal
 9 year ending the 30th day of June, the number of visas
 10 authorized for the year ending the 30th day of June, 1914,
 11 herein referred to as the "base number."
