Whereas the latest information on the number of persons in the country suffering from such diseases as heart disease, cancer, diabetes, rheumatism, arthritis, and other disabling diseases, injuries, and handicapping conditions is now fifteen years old and seriously out-of-date; and

Whereas such information is urgently needed for (1) an appraisal of the true state of health of our citizens, and (2) for the effective planning of any programs to improve their health, and (3) for research in the field of chronic diseases, and (4) for an evaluation of the impact of long illness upon the economic status of families with members so afflicted, and (5) for measurement of the numbers of persons in the working ages so disabled as to be unable to perform gainful work: Therefore

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the Surgeon General of the Public Health Service in
- 4 the Federal Security Agency is authorized and directed (1)
- 5 to make a survey of the population of the United States by
