## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

JANUARY 24, 1952

Mr. FOGARTY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

## A BILL

To amend the Universal Military Training and Service Act to provide that certain members of the National Guard and other reserve components, who served during World War II, shall be released from active duty upon completing seventeen months' active duty after June 24, 1950.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That the second sentence of section 21 of the Universal  
4       Military Training and Service Act is hereby amended to read  
5       as follows: "Unless sooner released under regulations pre-  
6       scribed by the Secretary of the military department con-  
7       cerned, any member of a Reserve component of the Armed  
8       Forces of the United States who served on active duty for

1 a period of twelve months or more in any branch of the  
2 Armed Forces during the period beginning December 7,  
3 1941, and ending September 2, 1945, and who has been  
4 or may hereafter be ordered to active duty pursuant to this  
5 section, shall upon completion of seventeen or more months  
6 of active duty after June 24, 1950, if he makes application  
7 therefor to the Secretary of the branch of service in which  
8 he is serving, be released from active duty and shall not  
9 thereafter be ordered to active duty for periods in excess of  
10 thirty days without his consent except in time of war or  
11 national emergency hereafter declared by the Congress."
