Mr. FOGARTY submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Whereas the American people are deeply religious people, and our great country was founded on the belief in the dignity of the individual and the rights of free men before God; and

Whereas men or nations are never without the urgent need for divine guidance: Therefore be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress (1) that
3 each day's session of the General Assembly of the United
4 Nations, and each day's session of any other international
5 organization of which the United States is a member, should
6 open with prayer; and (2) that the United States should
7 exert every effort to have such procedure adopted as a per-
8 manent policy by the United Nations and such other inter-
9 national organizations of which the United States is a
10 member.
