

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 That section 7 of the joint resolution entitled "Joint resolu-4 tion to codify and emphasize existing rules and customs pertaining to the display and use of the flag of the United 5 States of America", approved June 22, 1942, as amended 6 7 (36 U.S.C., sec. 172), is amended to read as follows: 8 "SEC. 7.
