To provide for the distribution of certain surplus commodities to needy persons in the United States, by use of a stamp plan.
 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 That in order to promote the general welfare, raise the levels
4 of health and of nourishment for needy persons whose incomes
5 prevent them from enjoying adequate diets, and to remove
6 the specter of want, malnutrition, or hunger in the midst of
7 mountains of surplus food now accumulating under Govern8 ment ownership in warehouses and other storage facilities;
9 and to stimulate employment in the woolen-textile industry;
10 the Secretary of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as the
11 "Secretary") is hereby authorized and directed to promul-

gate and put into operation, as quickly as possible, a program 1 2 to distribute to needy persons, and needy persons whose sole 3 source of income is a pension, or a benefit payment under the Old Age and Survivors Insurance Program of the Social 4 5 Security System, in the United States through a stamp 6 system: (a) a portion of the surpluses of food commodities 7 acquired and being stored by the Federal Government by 8 reason of its price-support operations or other purchase programs, and (b) woolen garments manufactured in the United 9 10 States.

11 SEC. 2. In carrying out such program, the Secretary 12 shall—

The food stamps shall be issued22by each such welfare department or equivalent agency23to needy persons receiving welfare assistance, or in need24of welfare assistance but ineligible because of State or25local law, and shall be redeemable by such needy per-

gate and put into operation, as quickly as possible, a program 1 sons at local distribution points to be determined by the 2 Secretary under section 2 (3). 3 (b) issue, to each welfare department or equivalent 4 agency of a State or political subdivision requesting 5 the distribution of woolen garments under section 2(5), 6 stamps for each kind of woolen garments which the Secretary shall have by regulation approved, in amounts 7-10/11 equalling $33\frac{1}{3}$ per centum of the total amount of old 8 age and survivors insurance benefit payments made to 10 the requesting State in the preceding calendar year. 11ad The Director of a State welfare department or equivalent 12 agency of a State or political subdivision receiving such 13 stamps shall distribute them to any individual applicant 14 in an amount which is not greater than $33\frac{1}{3}$ per centum

15 of the annual pension, or benefit payment, which the 16 applicant receives. 17 SEC. 4. Surplus food distributed under this Act shall 18 be in addition to, and not in place of, any welfare assistance 19 (financial or otherwise) granted needy persons by a State 20 ²⁰ or any political subdivision thereof. 21 SEC. 5. In any one calendar year the Secretary is au-22 thorized to distribute surplus food and woolen garments under 88 23 this Act of a value of up to \$2,000,000,000. 24 SEC. 6. The distribution of surplus food to needy persons ²⁵ in the United States under this Act shall be in place of distribution to such needy persons under section 32 of the Act
 entitled "An Act to amend the Agricultural Adjustment
 Act, and for other purposes", approved August 24, 1935
 (7 U. S. C., sec. 612c), as amended, and section 416 of the
 Agricultural Act of 1949. Distribution of surplus food under
 this Act shall be subject to the same system of priorities as
 is presently provided for in such sections.

8 SEC. 7. For the purposes of this Act, a needy person 9 is anyone receiving welfare assistance (financial or other-10 wise) from the welfare department or equivalent agency of 11 any State or political subdivision thereof, or who is, in the 12 opinion of such agency or agencies, in need of welfare as-13 sistance but is ineligible to receive it because of State or local 14 law.

15 SEC. 8. There are hereby authorized to be appropriated,
16 out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
17 such sums as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of
18 this Act.
