Whereas, in its efforts to attain that objective, the Soviet Union, through force of arms, subversion, infiltration, and other methods, has imposed puppet Communist regimes upon the people of the captive nations of Eastern and Central Europe and exerted tireless effort to crush their spirit and to transform their countries into replicas—on political, economic, social, cultural, and administrative levels—of the Soviet Union; and

Whereas, in direct violation of the provisions of the Yalta agreement, the people of the captive nations are still being denied the opportunity to solve their problems by democratic means

and to choose, through free and unfettered elections, national governments of their own free choice; and

- Whereas, in contravention of duly ratified treaties of peace, of the Charter of the United Nations, of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and of expressions of the United Nations General Assembly, the people of the captive nations are being systematically deprived of the exercise of fundamental freedoms and basic human rights; and
- Whereas the United States of America has consistently refused to sanction, either directly or by implication, the political status quo of the captive nations; and
