Mr. FOGARTY submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the
Committee on Foreign Affairs

RESOLUTION

Whereas the House of Representatives, Sixty-fifth Congress (1919), third session, by H.J. Res. 357, duly passed a resolution declaring that the people of Ireland should have the right to determine the form of government under which they desire to live; and

Whereas the maintenance of international peace and security requires settlement of the question of the unification of Ireland; and

Whereas twenty-six of the thirty-two counties of Ireland have been successful in obtaining international recognition for the Republic of Ireland which has, as its basic law, a constitution modeled upon our own American Constitution:
Now, therefore, be it

- 1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of this House of Repre-
- 2 sentatives that the Republic of Ireland should embrace the

1 entire territory of Ireland unless a clear majority of all the
2 people of Ireland, in a free plebiscite, determine and declare
3 to the contrary.
