## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. FOGARTY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Banking and Currency

## A BILL

To authorize the coinage of 50-cent pieces in commemoration of the two hundredth anniversary of the Touro Synagogue.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That, in commemoration of the two hundredth anniversary  
4       of the Touro Synagogue at Newport, Rhode Island, there  
5       shall be coined twenty-five thousand silver 50-cent pieces of  
6       standard size, weight, and composition. The profile of  
7       George Washington shall appear on one side of such pieces  
8       with his immortal words "To Bigotry No Sanction" inscribed  
9       under such profile, and on the reverse side of such pieces there  
10      shall appear a likeness of the Touro Synagogue.

11      SEC. 2. The coins herein authorized shall bear the date

1 1963, irrespective of the year in which they are minted,  
2 and shall be legal tender at the amount of their face value.

3 SEC. 3. All laws now in force relating to the subsidiary  
4 silver coins of the United States and the coining or striking of  
5 the same, regulating and guarding the process of coinage,  
6 providing for the purchase of material, and for the trans-  
7 portation, distribution, and redemption of coins, for the pre-  
8 vention of debasement or counterfeiting, for the security of  
9 the coins, or for any other purpose, whether such laws are  
10 penal or otherwise, shall, so far as applicable, apply to the  
11 coinage herein authorized.

To amend the act of August 1, 1906, relating to the coinage of 50-cent pieces in commemoration of the two hundredth anniversary of the Town of Syngogue.  
As it passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,  
That, in commemoration of the two hundredth anniversary of the Town of Syngogue at Newport, Rhode Island, there shall be coined twenty-five thousand silver 50-cent pieces of standard size, weight, and composition. The profile of George Washington shall appear on one side of such pieces with his immortal words "To Rigority No Sanction" inscribed under such profile, and on the reverse side of such pieces there shall appear a likeness of the Town of Syngogue.  
SEC. 3. The coins herein authorized shall bear the date

1 1963, irrespective of the year in which they are minted,  
2 and shall be legal tender at the amount of their face value.

3 Sec. 3. All laws now in force relating to the subsidiary  
4 silver coins of the United States and the coining or striking of  
5 the same, including and guarding the process of coinage,
