103-MORE COLLEGES WILL HELP TO TRAIN ARMY SPECIALISTS

War Department Expands List of Institutions Joining in Its Technical Program n. 9. Times, may 30 43 CONTRACTS DUE AT ONCE

60,000 Will Be at Work in the Medical, Dental and Other Fields Before End of July

WASHINGTON, May 29 - One hundred and three additional colleges and universities have been selected to participate in the Army Specialized Training Program, bringing the total number in the project to 145, the War Department said today. Commanding generals of the Service Commands throughout the country have been authorized to negotiate contracts immediately with the newly named colleges.

The opening term at most of the newly selected units is scheduled for June, with the opening at the others due in July. Additional colleges were expected to be named later, the War Department said.

At present the Army has contracts at twenty-eight specialized training units and twenty-two specialized training and reassignment units. Eight of the star units are at universities where Army specialized training units are established. The program has been in operation on college campuses since late March.

At Star units selected soldiers are housed, classified and instructed and are finally designated for specific courses study in the Army Specialized Training Program in the highest term for which they are qualified. Soldiers remain at Star units for a period of from five to thirty days and are then sent to Army Specialized Training Units. At these units qualified trainees receive prescribed instruction in specific curricula for one or more twelve-week terms.

21,068 Now Under Program

According to the War Department, more than 30,000 trainees will be in the Army Specialized Training Program by the end of June and nearly 60,000 will be in the program by the end of July. As of May 21 there were 21,068 soldiers under the program. This includes 4,668 who recently were ordered to new Army Specialized Training Units, at which they are receiving work preparatory to the opening term at those units on June 14.

The War Department has set an over-all quota of 150,000 trainees at any one time in the program.

cialized program has moved into high gear had earned the favorable comment of several leading educators, the War Department stated. It cited a letter sent to Brig. Gen. Joe N. Dalton, Director of Personnel, Army Service Forces, by Dr. Felix Morley, president of Haverford College, which said in part:

"May I take this opportunity to express my deep admiration at the astonishing skill with which the Army has so quickly laid the foundation of a specialized training program which must command the respect of every competent professional educator. Frankly, I would not have believed it possible that you would have been able to accomplish as much as you have done in so brief a period."

By the end of July, there will be seventy-four units at which medi-cal instruction will be provided, thirty-eight units for dental training, ten units for veterinary medical training, eighty-two for basic phase instruction, twenty-five for advanced engineering, seventeen for foreign area and language study, nine for advanced personnel psychology, six for pre-professional training and twenty-three Star units.
