THE CASE OF MR. DANIEL H. O'GRADY

THE FOLLOWING POINTS SHOULD BE NOTED:

1 The Army Specialized Training Program is composed of 3 parts:

1. Scholastic
- 2 Physical
- 3 Military

It should be noted most emphatically that these 3 form a UNITY,
and, hence each one are fundamental to the Program.

2 Each of these 3 parts demands Instructors.

3 All Instructors for each branch of this UNIFIED Program are under
CONTRACT with the War Department.

It was and is the obligation of the individual College to provide
the War Department with all facilities and Instructors.

After the College has performed this part of its obligation the
War Department contracts with the College for these
facilities and Instructors.

The War Department does not require that the College ^{to} procure
facilities or Instructors from any specific place or any
specific man-power category.

4 Mr. O'Grady is under contract with the War Department in the
Army Specialized Training Program in the specific category
of Physical Education.

5. Mr. O'Grady has a MASTER'S DEGREE in Physical Education.

He is an expert in his avocation.

6 THE PROGRAM : PHYSICAL FITNESS.

Calisthenics
 Wrestling
 Boxing
 Tumbling
 Volleyball
 Basket Ball
 Cross Country Running

Mr. O'Grady gives 33 hours per week to this Program.

It should be noted that (1) only 16 hours per week are given at Rhode Island State per Physical Educational Instructor, and (2) that 18 hours per week are required of Instructors in the Scholastic part of the Program.

Mr. O'Grady is greatly over worked BECAUSE of the lack of Physical Educational Instructors.

7. Mr. O'Grady cannot be replaced.

The College has done everything possible to replaced him and in fact to get more Educational Instructors.

The College has applied to the following institutions in this connection:

1. Notre Dame University
2. Springfield College.

Here it should be noted that this College has Physical Educational as its main objective and graduates yearly an average of 150 men.

In their reply to us they stated that Providence College was the 100th on the list applying for Physical Instructors.
