

REPORT ON MR. PETER CREAMER--WORCESTER BOARD--Post Office

Made at Frank Magee's Office--Friday, March 19, 1943:

1. He took his physical in Providence, March 19th.
He has passed his physical.
But the blood test will not be back in Providence Office
for about 5 days.
Then this report will be sent to Worcester Local Board, and,
he will be immediately be classified IA, and, receive
the next day his IA Card.
2. It is vitally important that FORM 42 be in the hands of his
Local Worcester Board before the report from Providence
arrives in Worcester and he receives his IA Card. If this
is not done his case is hopeless.
3. There are two questions in FORM 42 that must be answered
with very great care, namely:
 - (1) What specific steps have you taken to secure or train
a replacement for this registrant?
 - (2) Description of the activities of this company.

One answer for the FIRST question might be:
That you have applied to the U.S. Unemployment service,
Or that you have advertised in the papers.
In neither case have you been able to secure a replace-
ment.

The SECOND question should be in DETAIL and answered on a
separate sheet of paper, and, then, the paper pasted onto
the FORM 42.

PROCEDURE IF FORM 42 WHICH IS FILLED OUT BY FATHER DILLON
IS RETURNED WITH A REFUSAL FOR DEFERMENT.

1. Both Peter Creamer and Father Dillon will be notified
of Worcester Board decision on Form 42.
2. Peter will have 10 days in which to appeal the case, BUT
GET IN CONNECTION WITH FRANK MAGEE BEFORE ACTING.
3. Frank Magee suggest that I go to Worcester on next Monday
Night and present FORM 42 to the Board.
4. If deferred IMPORTANT to remember that it is only for
6 MONTHS AND WILL HAVE TO BE RENEWED.
