The College is Completely Prepared to Handle 500 Soldiers:

1 CONTRACT:

Through the services of our Architect and Accountant all information for the several sections of the contract has been gathered and classified as specified in the contract.

We are, therefore, prepared to negotiate a contract at any time.

A complete plan of operation has been worked out, and, is ready to be put into action as soon as the contract is negotiated.

2 HOUSING:

250 double decker steel beds have been bought, and, are on the campus.

500 springs also

500 mattresses

3 MESSING:

Facilities are available for feeding 500 at a time.

4 MEDICAL CARE:

Facilities have been increased

5 CURRICULUM :

A master plan setting forth the curriculum BE-1 in all its details has been drawn up. It is based on the Army day and week, and, is laid out in accordance with the outlines and syllabi of the program received from the Army Headquarters. It presents the schedule of all class and laboratory periods and all points in physical education, and, allows for various adjustments of time for military science so that the wishes of the Commandant may be easily fulfilled.

6 FACULTY:

The several departments have been organized for teaching the curriculum, and, have been supplemented with an efficient personnel. Each department represents an efficient and enthusiastic group of professors who stand ready to put the master plan into operation.

7 INSTRUCTIONAL FACILITIES :

Classrooms and laboratories have been put in readiness to meet the schedules as set forth in the master plan. Equipment in the laboratories has been supplemented to meet the needs.

8 PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

Facilities are ready to meet the needs. Arrangements have also been made for complete instruction in swimming and for excellent pool facilities.
