SUGGESTIONS IN SELECTING FACULTY May 13,1943

- 1. In the sixth point of our OUTLINE to General Dalton it says
 "Each department represents an efficient and enthusias;
 tic group of professors who are ready to put the
 master plan in operation".
- 2. Col. Beukema's letter of April 26th said:
 - "The availability of properly qualified trainness is the limiting facotr in such assignments".
- 3. Col. Beukema speaking to the Representatives of three Colleges said:
 - "The Army is greatly disappointed with the intellectual training of boys received at West Point, and, isedetermined to do something about it, even if it means going to the Legislatures of each State".
- 4. Through The Classification Boards at Each Camp the Army T is taking great care to select candidates and place them where they will prove of greatest benefit to the Army.
- No one knows the <u>length</u> of the Army Specialized Training Program. If the College wishes to participate in the program for as long as it endures, the best effort must be made to have the most efficient men on the staff in order to render the most efficient service.
