She is an American citizen and in private life Mrs. Edward Ford Stevenson. The late King Albert of the Belgians knighted her with the Order of Leopold. France made her an Officer d'Academie. Great Britain has given her the Coronation Medal. The New York Metropolitan Museum of Art has acquired her famous portrait bust of the late Lord Tweedsmuir, Governor General of Canada. She was the first artist to have the Dionne Quintuplets as living models. We are looking forward to a very pleasant afternoon and hope you will join us.
