In 1943, Malcolm Ekstrand was one of 380 members of Unit #1188 of the U.S. Army Specialized Training Program who were enrolled at Providence College.

Their promised education was cut short.

These young men answered the urgent call
to serve their nation
and courageously served in the

328th Infantry Regiment of the 26th Yankee Division.
They marched with General George Patton
and fought in the Battle of the Bulge.

In Northern France, Dr. Ekstrand served on permanent KP duty.

On Palm Sunday, Dr. Ekstrand was driving his captain and they were both shot and taken by the Germans.

Malcolm was separated from his Captain and put in a room with nineteen wounded German soldiers.

There was no pain medicine available and only a little bread and water for food.

After six days, he was liberated by American forces.

Dr. Ekstrand returned to the States after his discharge and went on to graduate from Temple University and became a podiatrist.

He had a practice in Warwick for many years.

For the past two years, Dr. Ekstrand has resided at the Scandinavian Retirement Center Assisted Living Community.
