At the helm of the Lady Friars as they enter their first season of varsity competition is Kelly Keane, a 1982 graduate of Providence College who is presently enrolled in the school's graduate program. Majoring in Education/Guidance and Counseling, Kelly will be receiving her Masters of Education Degree this December.

One of eleven children, Kelly enrolled at Providence College in the fall of 1978. An honors graduate, she traveled to Ireland her junior year as part of the college's student exchange program. Captain of the college's lacrosse team her senior year, she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education/History and Humanities.

Beginning a varsity program at any institution is no small matter. Last season, with club status, she coached the Lady Friars to an impressive 8-2-1 record. Included among the eight victories were six shutouts. As the team prepares to enter its first season of varsity competition, Keane has earned the role of head coach.

A native of Needham, Massachusetts, Kelly lettered in soccer, basketball and lacrosse while at Needham High School. After enrolling at Providence College in '78, she joined the Lady Friars soccer and volleyball as well as lacrosse teams.

A resident of Providence, Rhode Island, Kelly is currently also the assistant coach for the PC womens lacrosse team.

A Look Back and a Look Ahead

Providence College's 1982 womens soccer team, under club status, concluded the season with an impressive 8-2-1 overall record. Beginning their first season of varsity competition, the squad can look back to a year full of great accomplishments.

Looking to acquire varsity and NCAA status, the team, under Coach Kelly Keane, quickly proved to administration and area competition that they were quite serious. This season, a squad made up of ten returnees and seven rookies look to prove that they have, indeed, earned their varsity title.

Leading the way is Susan Passander, possibly one of the best athletes ever to enroll at Providence College. A native of Ansonia, Connecticut, Sue has participated in 6 varsity sports in 3 years of college. Called by Coach Keane "One of the finest all-around athletes I've ever known," Passander sets the pace for the rest of the club.

Co-captains Kathy Zweir '84 and Karen Joyce '85 will also have to be heavy contributors if the Lady Friars are to control the tempo of their games and maintain a competitive edge. Kathy will be looked to for leadership and ball control in the backfield while "Joycer" will be playing the role of motivator and playmaker.

Others contributing to the cause immediately will be Ann Malzone and Lisa Shaw, both freshmen who bring with them an added dimension. "Malzy's strong foot and extra speed will certainly prove to be invaluable to us this season and, with a heavy background in soccer, Lisa will bring us her fine technique and daring dives as a starting goalie," said Keane.

As the Lady Friars were preparing for their first varsity season, they certainly looked to play the best opposition available. The season opens with a game against the University of Connecticut, ranked #14 nationally and a team which defeated the University of North Carolina last year, the number 1 ranked school for womens soccer in the nation.

But that's the way both Keane and the squad want it. "We got to where we are by proving both to ourselves and others that we are worthy of being at the varsity level. Last year's record and accolades are certainly accomplishments that we are very proud of, but they're not nearly as important as what we hope to accomplish this season."

Spurred by a desire to "do their best" and carried by the enthusiasm and energy of last year's returnees, the Providence College Lady Friars look forward to a season of great expectations.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Providence College, resting on a hillside 104 acre campus, has become one of the nation's most prominent educational institutions. Under the auspices of the Roman Catholic Church, the Dominican Fathers made a special commitment to the State of Rhode Island in 1917 and founded Providence College. Originally an all male school, PC became co-educational in 1971.

The academic excellence of Providence College is based upon the more than 700 combined years of knowledge that the Dominican Priests, Brothers and Sisters bring to the college. Future students can choose from among 30 disciplines while working towards an undergraduate degree in either a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science program. Included in the unique academic programs offered are a team taught Development of Western Civilization course; a cooperative engineering program with the University of Notre Dame, Columbia and Washington University; a junior year abroad program involving universities in England, Ireland, Japan, Portugal, and Switzerland, as well as a summer program in Pietrasanta, Italy.

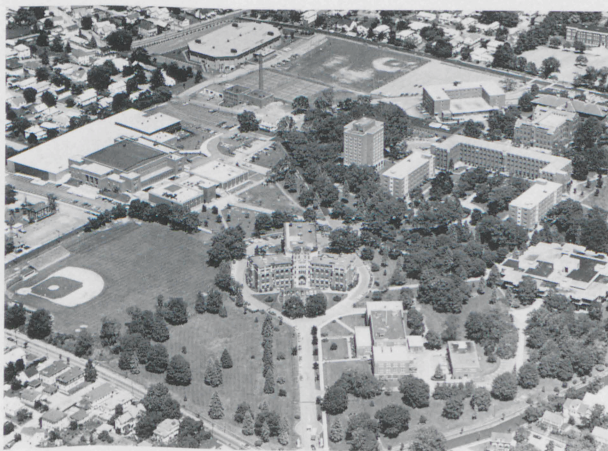
Clearly, Providence offers a great deal to her prospective students. Over the years the campus has grown to include such facilities as a award-winning library, a recently renovated theater, a multi-faceted student union building, one of the nation's finest collegiate ice arenas, and a recreational facility which houses a swimming pool, raquetball/squash courts, tennis, basketball courts and a running track. The college also boasts a nationally acclaimed theater arts program, an award-winning student newspaper and numerous intramural athletic teams, student clubs and organizations.

The athletic excellence of Providence College is also notorious. The department now offers twenty-two varsity sports teams which compete in tough Division I programs: Baseball, Basketball (men and women), cross country (men and women), field hockey (women), golf (men), ice hockey (men and women), indoor track (men and women), lacrosse (men and women), outdoor track (men and women), soccer (men and women), softball (women), tennis (men and women), volleyball (men), and volleyball (women). Last year, ten of the twenty-one varsity squads (women's soccer is new in 1983-84) sent teams to regional, divisional or conference championships, including the men's cross country and ice hockey teams which participated in the NCAA championship finals. Student-Athletes at Providence College are a special breed, for their education comes first. It takes an extremely well rounded and disciplined individual to participate on a Friar athletic team because of such emphasis upon his or her studies.

The college has given Rhode Island more than 9,000 graduates who are making their own individual, lasting

contribution to society. One-third of all Rhode Island physicians, dentists and secondary education teachers as well as one-fourth of all attorneys practicing in the state are graduates of Providence College. This sense of giving by the college has been generously reciprocated by the alumni over the years, as participation in the college's annual Loyalty Fund continues to climb. Established in 1942, the PC Loyalty Fund provides the college with necessary funds on a recurring basis that can be used where and when they are most needed. The Loyalty Fund has generated more than \$6,000,000 for essential projects increasing from \$5,000 in 1942 to \$863,000 this past year. Approximately forty-three percent of all alumni solicited contributed to the 1982-83 Fund which is more than double the seventeen percent average alumni participation rate for colleges and universities throughout the country.

Providence College's enrollment of approximately 3500 undergraduate students is representative of each state in the nation as well as many foreign countries. PC is small enough for everyone to feel at home yet diversified enough to meet an individual's needs. It is an institution with a past full of achievements and a vision for an even greater future.
