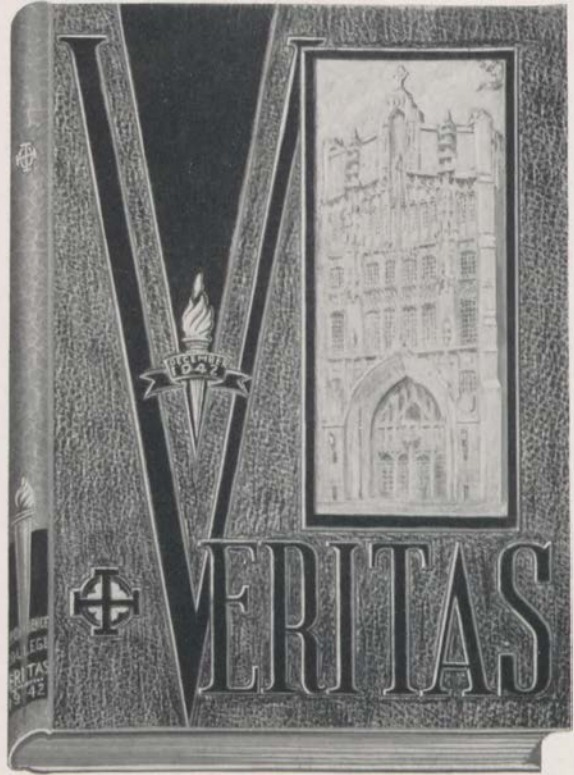

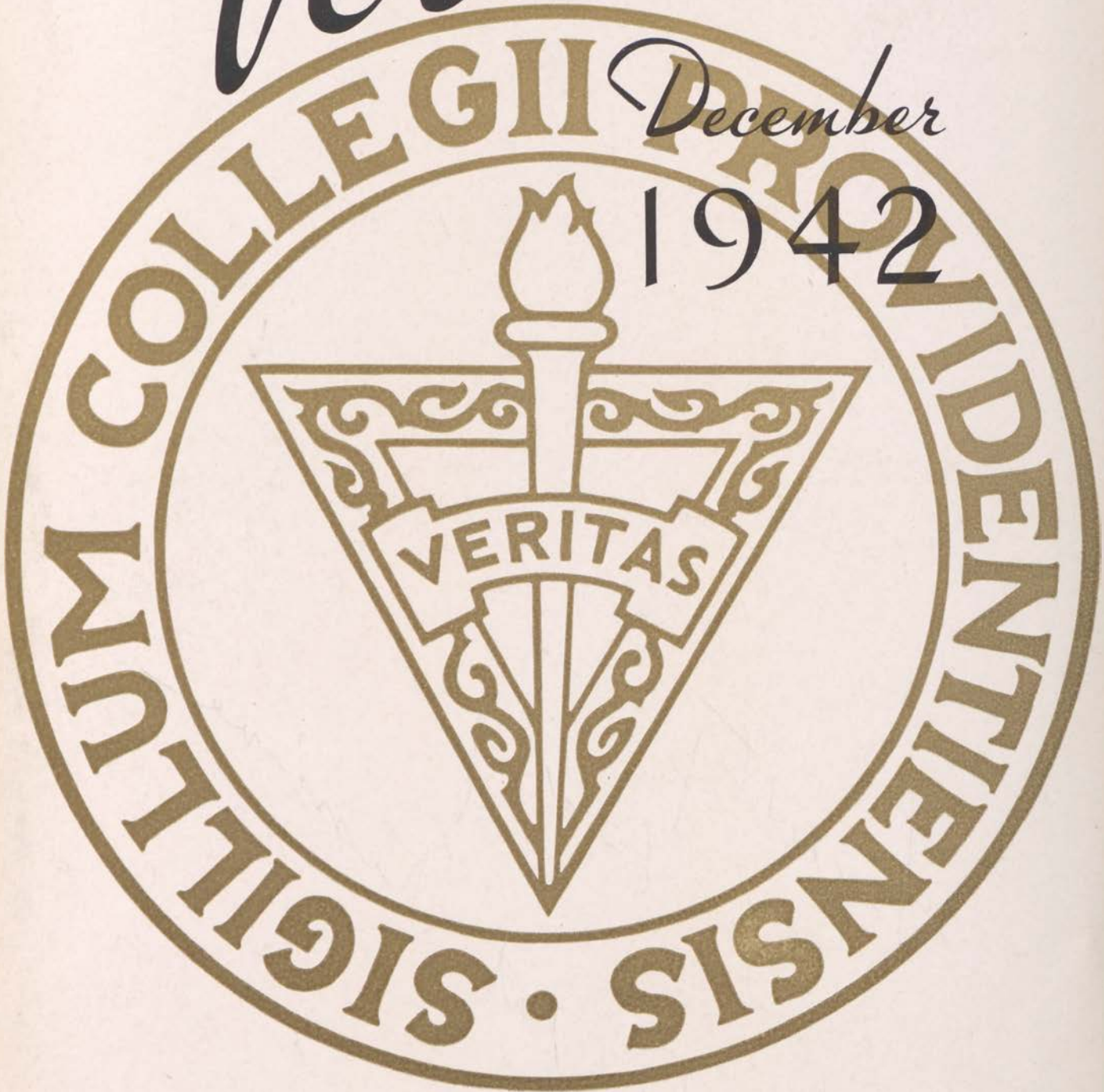

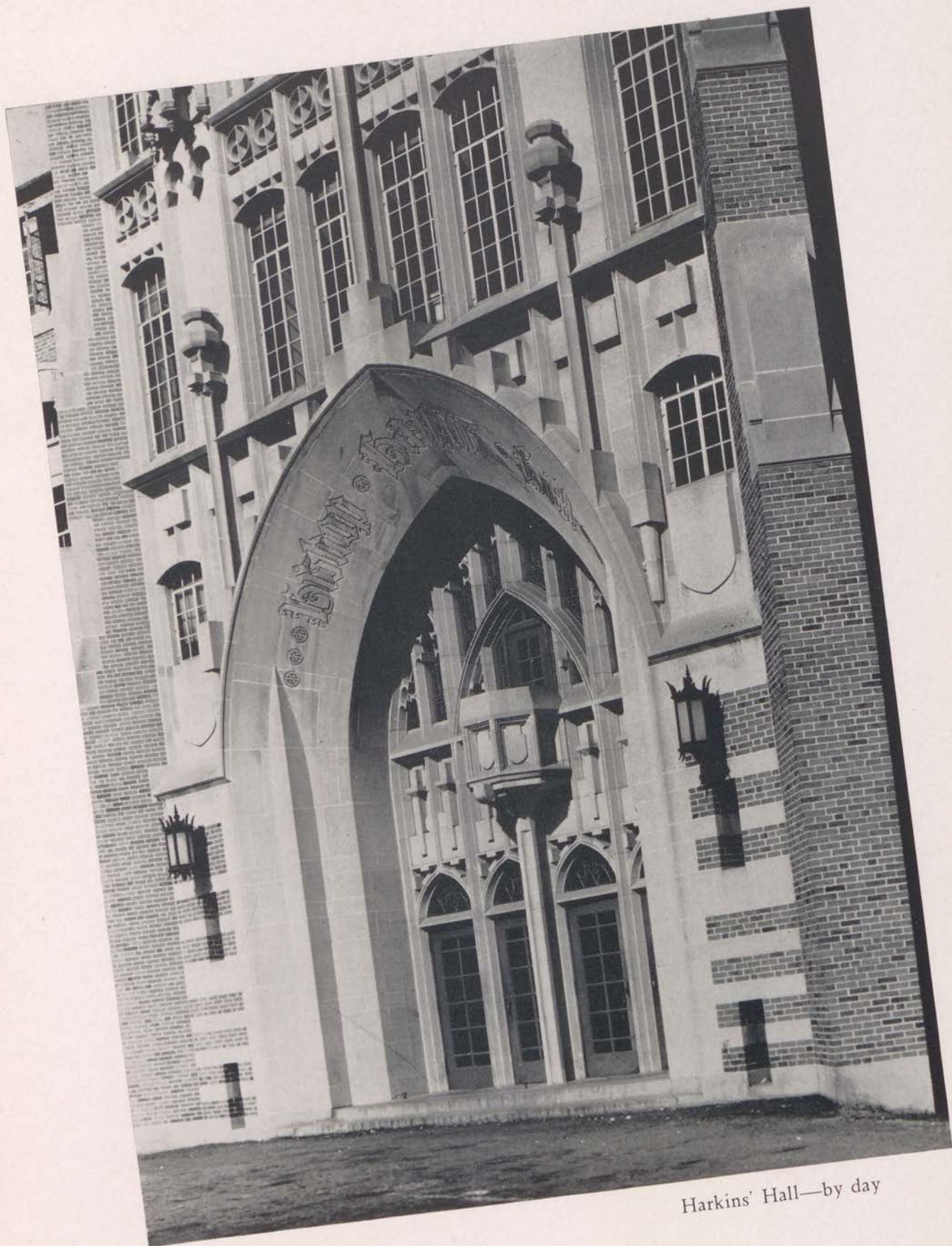

Foreword

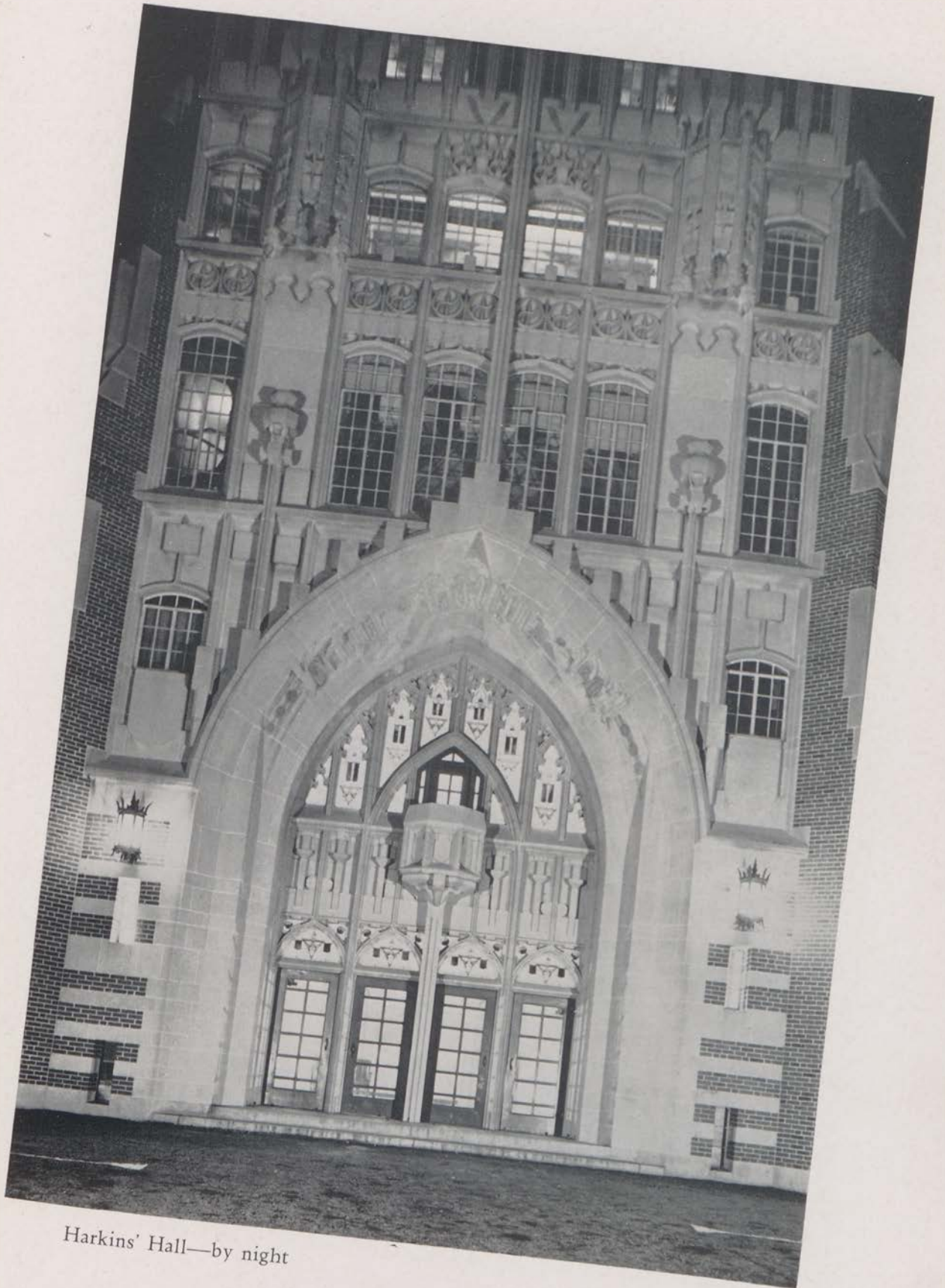

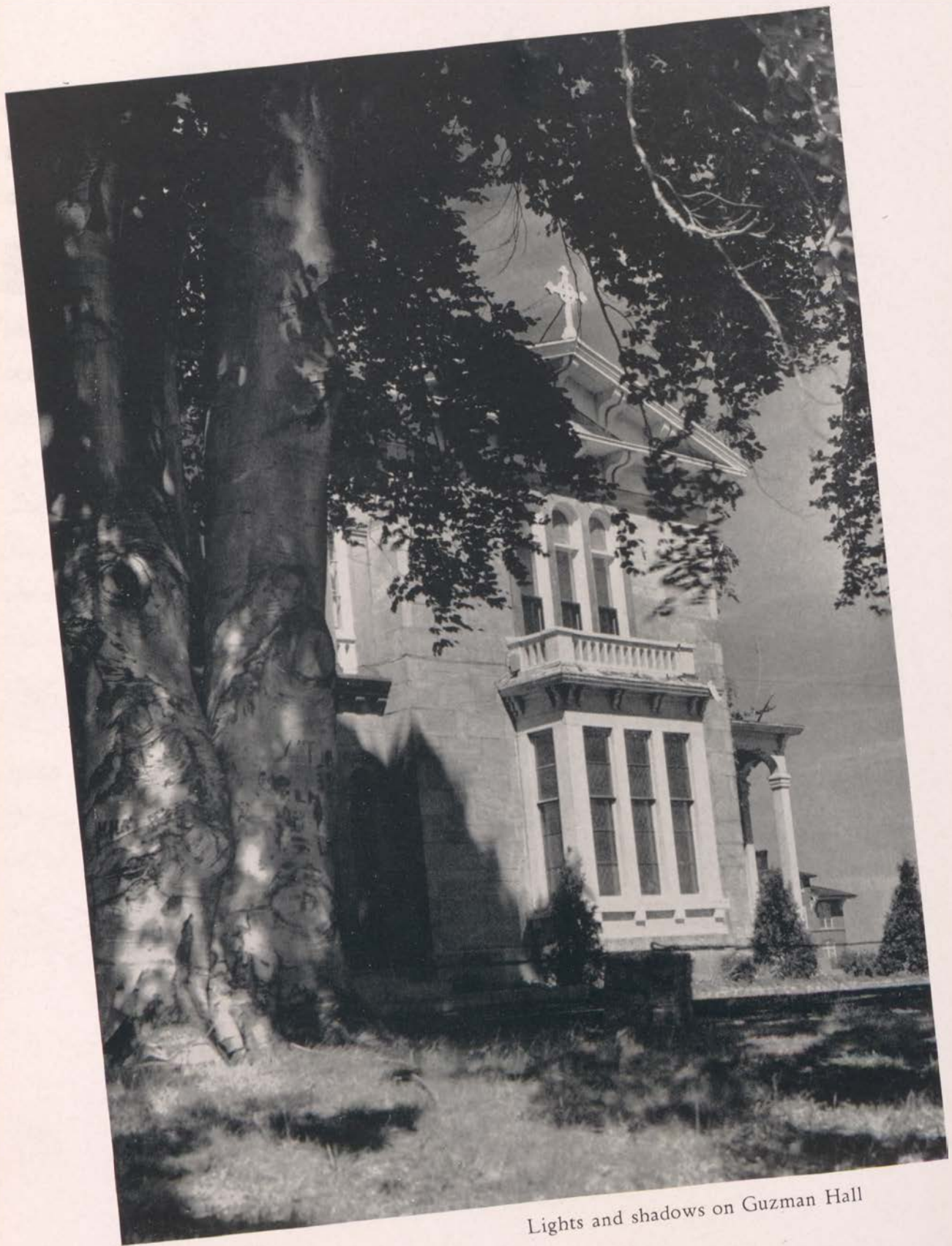
But even war cannot dim the memories of those men who graduate in its midst. This little book will stand forever as a living proof of that. . . —



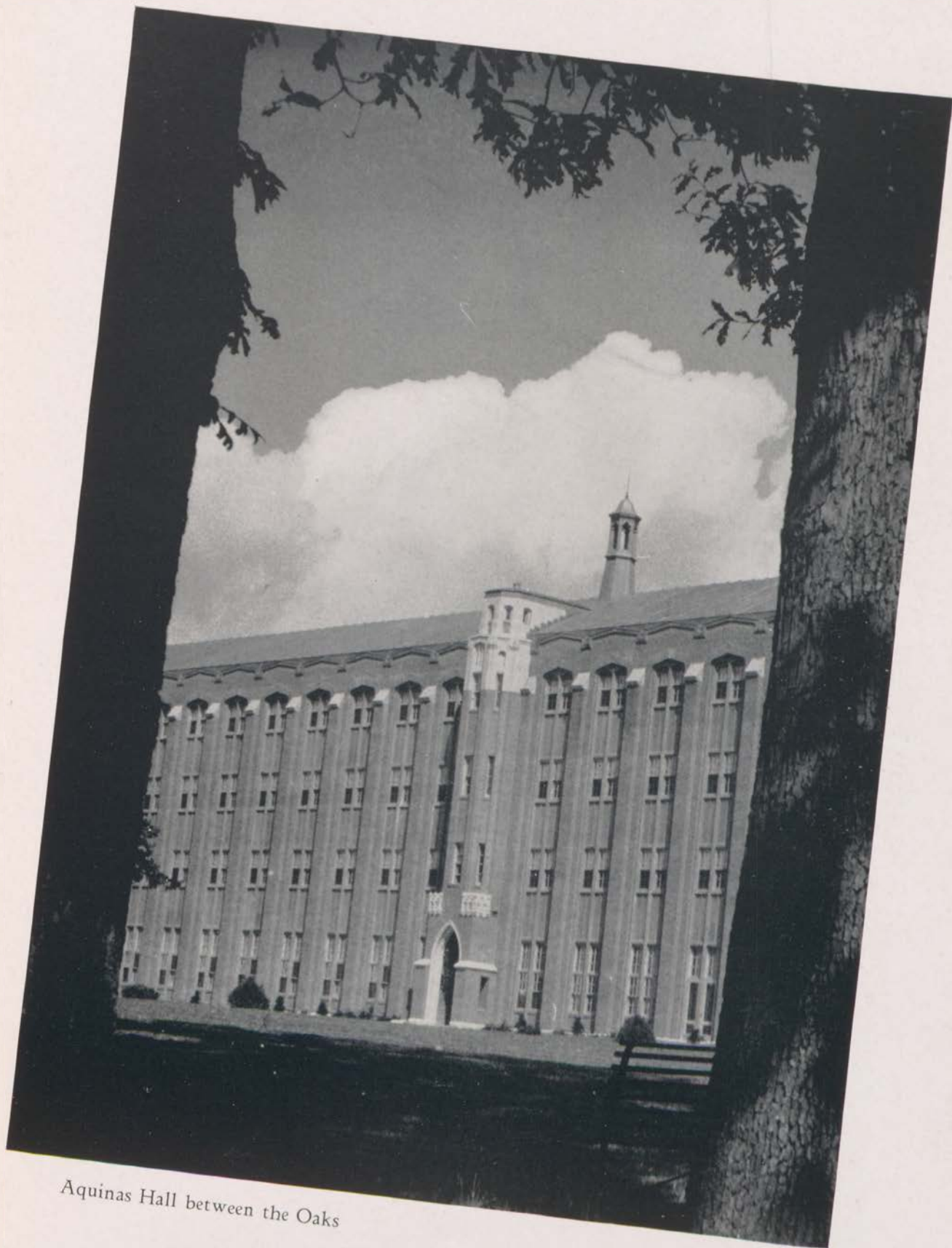
Harkins' Hall—by day

Aquinas Hall between the Oaks

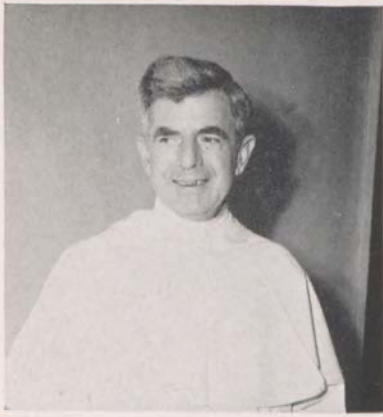

Providence College regained its traditional supremacy in inter-collegiate baseball during the summer season of 1942 by capturing the Eastern Collegiate Baseball Crown.

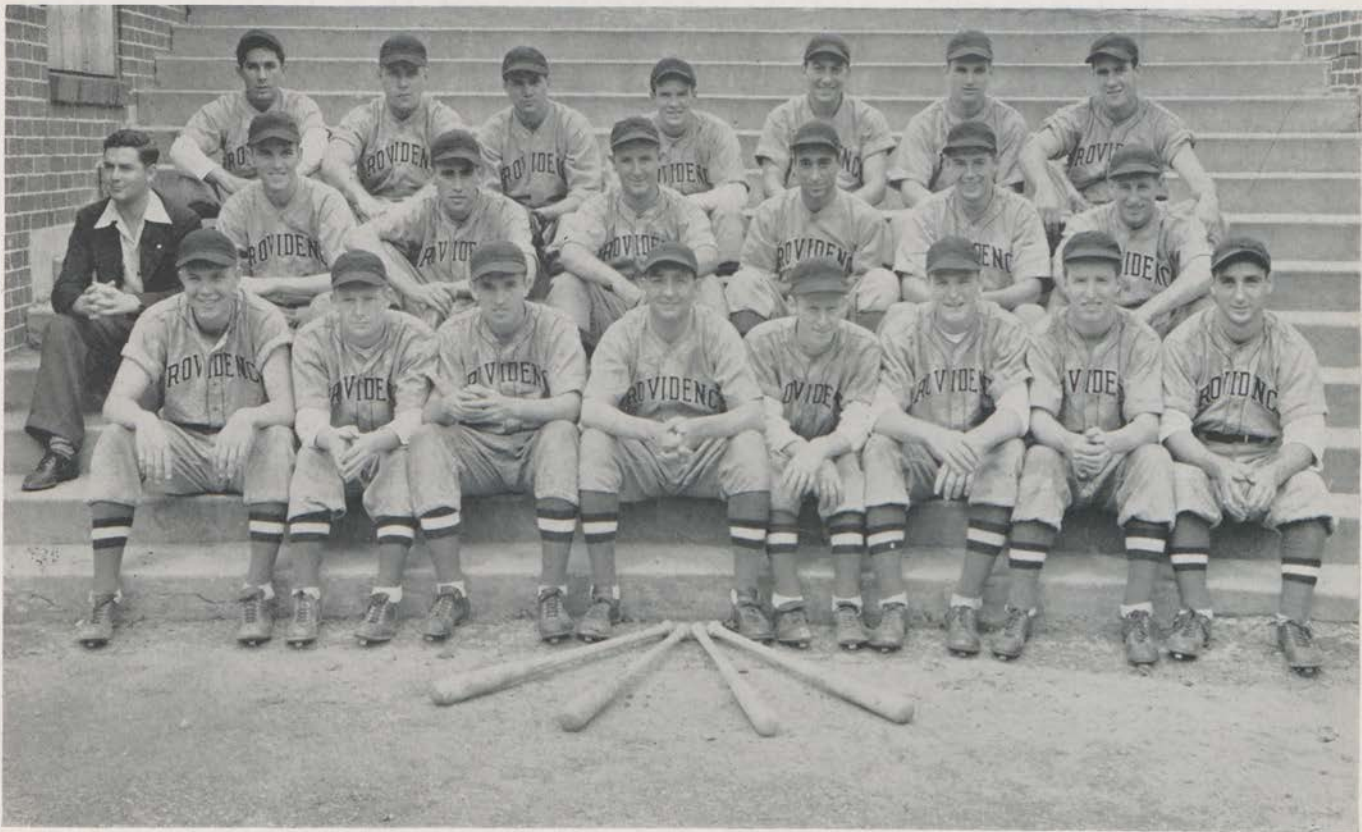
The Friars went through their College schedule undefeated save for the last game of the season, when Williams College, in a return game, won 2-1, in extra innings.
