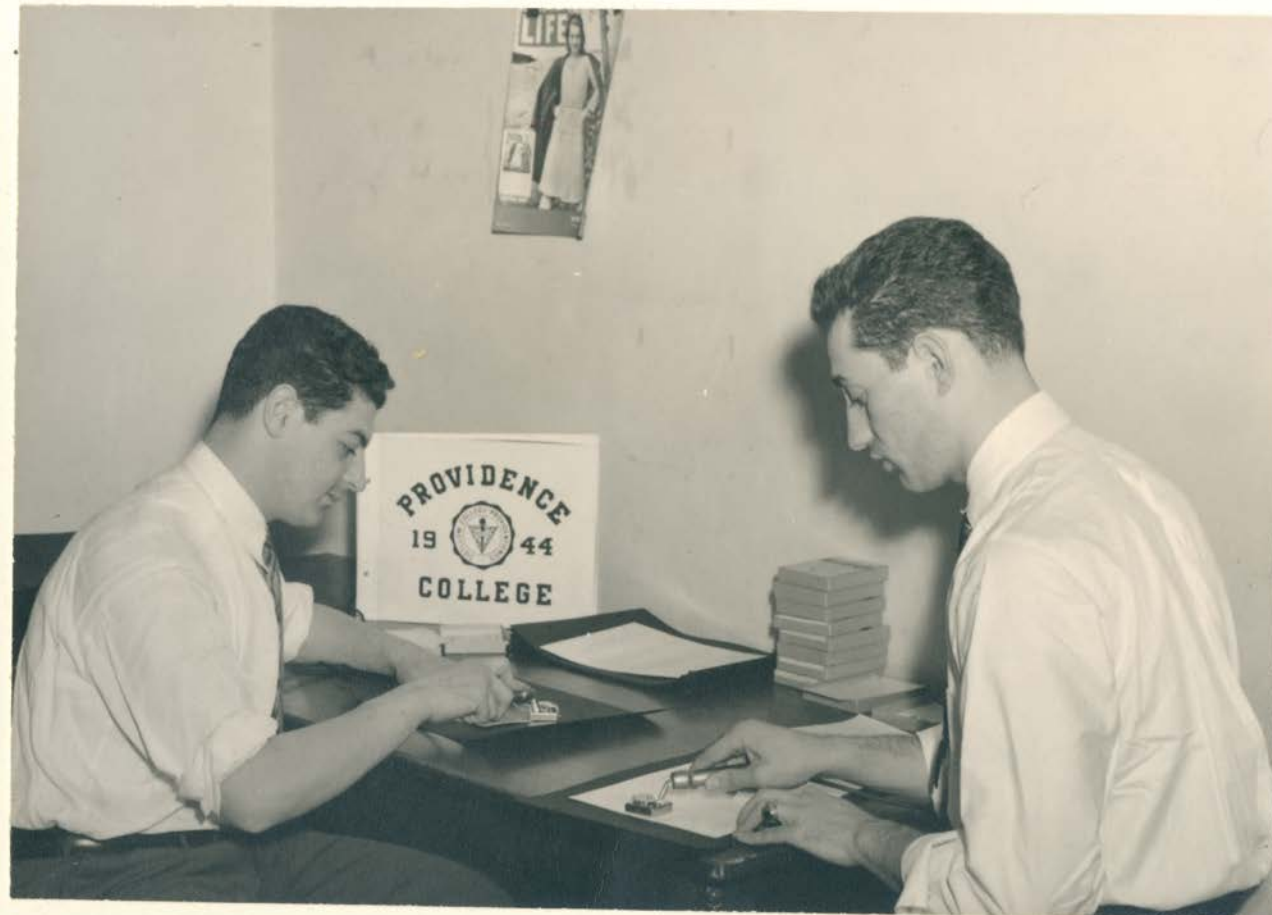

P.C. Men Practice Ironing in Turning Out New Veritas

After they have added a couple of missing pages to the nearly completed volume, Providence College seniors who will be graduated tomorrow, will have carried on a great tradition by producing the annual yearbook, Veritas, in what might be described as an abbreviated, ersatz edition.

The dauntless seniors are holding a couple of pages open for pictorial "shots" of Sunday's commencement exercises, the first class to have a book with pictures of their own graduation.

This is possible because the book, instead of the usual bound volume, is more like an old-fashioned picture album, published by the seniors themselves.

They selected some 30 pictures and composites, depicting campus life and personalities, enlarged them, and mounted them on individual album pages. At the sug-

gestion of Class President David Coughlin, they used old-fashioned flat irons to wax the pictures firmly into place.

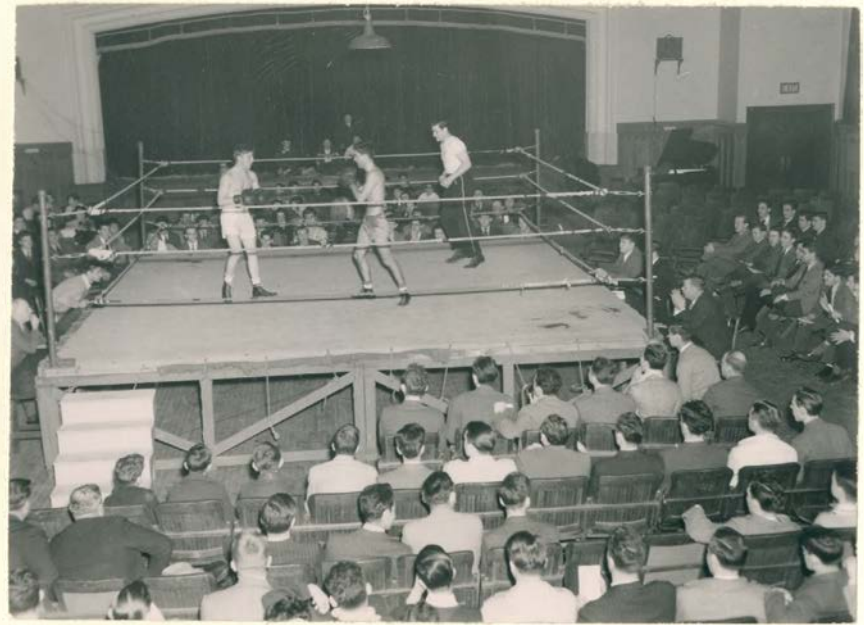
Printed material was taken from previous editions of Veritas. No new copper plates were used. The class had voted against using any strategic material, even if available.

Pictorial highlights of the book include "shots" of the Army specialized training unit drilling on Hendricken Field and the Convocation honoring Bishop Paul Yu-Pin of China.

There was no staff, as such. Everyone helped. Among the more active flatiron wielders were David Coughlin, Pawtucket; Joseph Bruno, Hamden, Conn.; Gregory Rocha, Taunton, Mass.; George Reilly, West Warwick, and Philip Genaro, Passaic, N. J. Rev. William R. Clark, O. P., senior class moderator, directed the project.

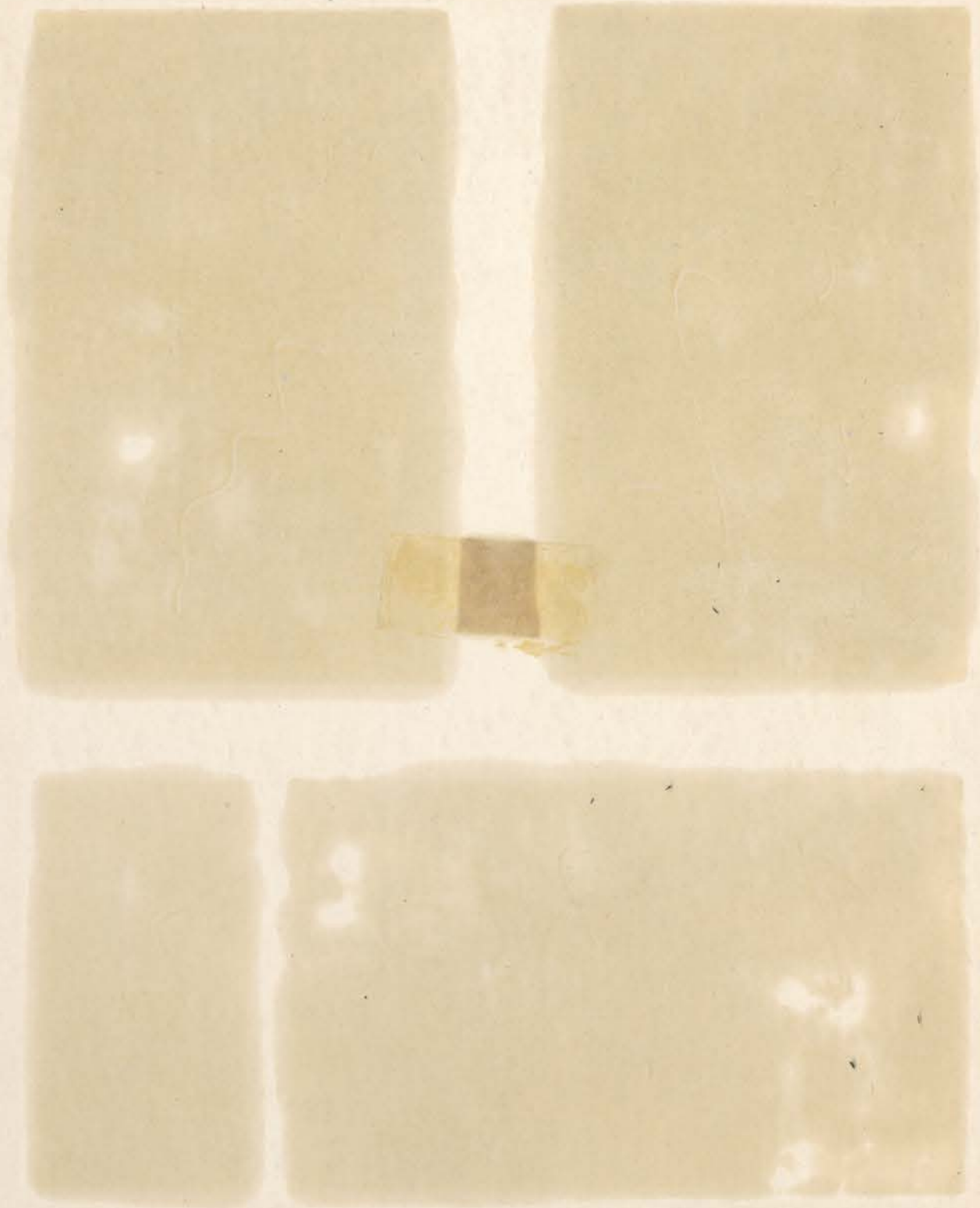

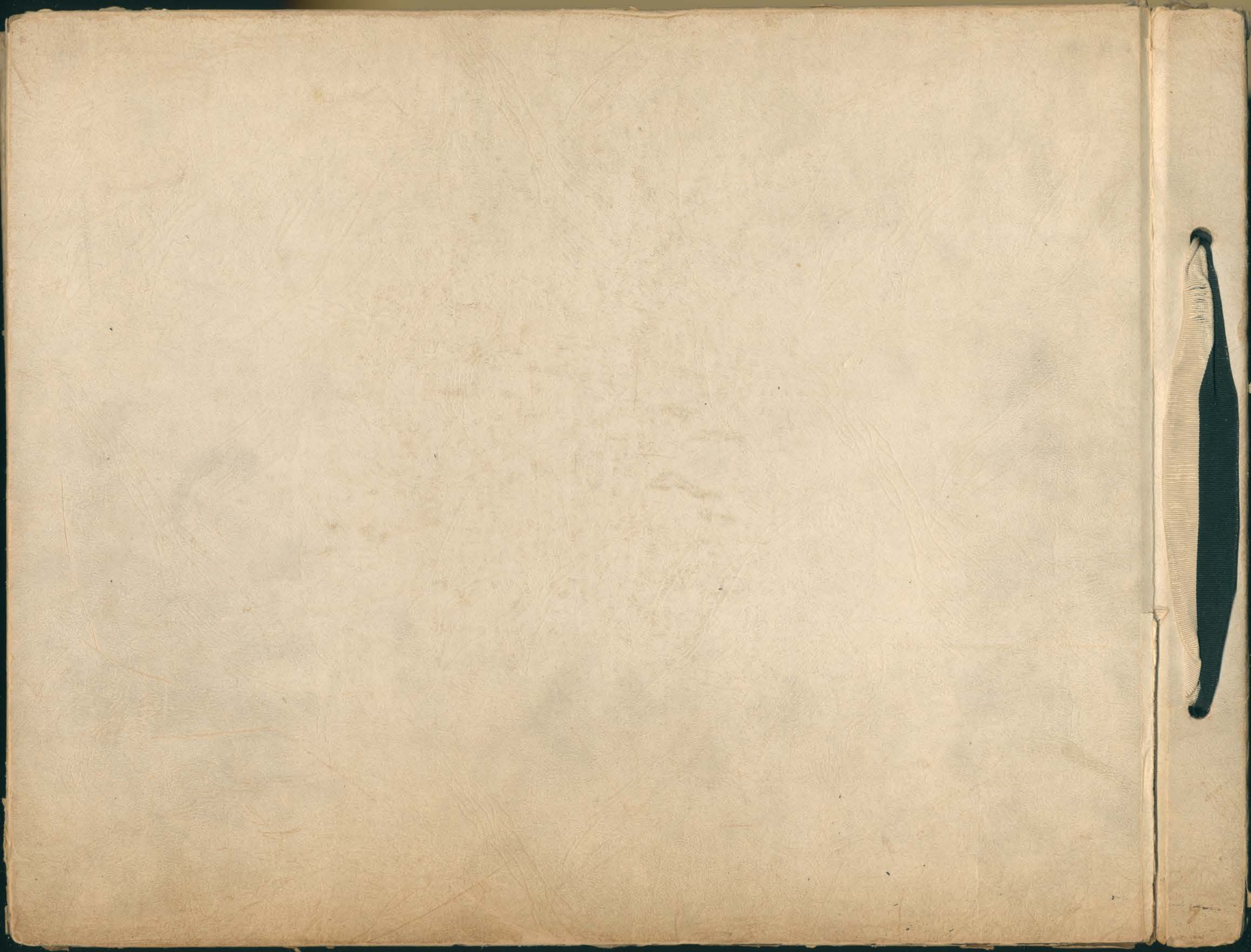
