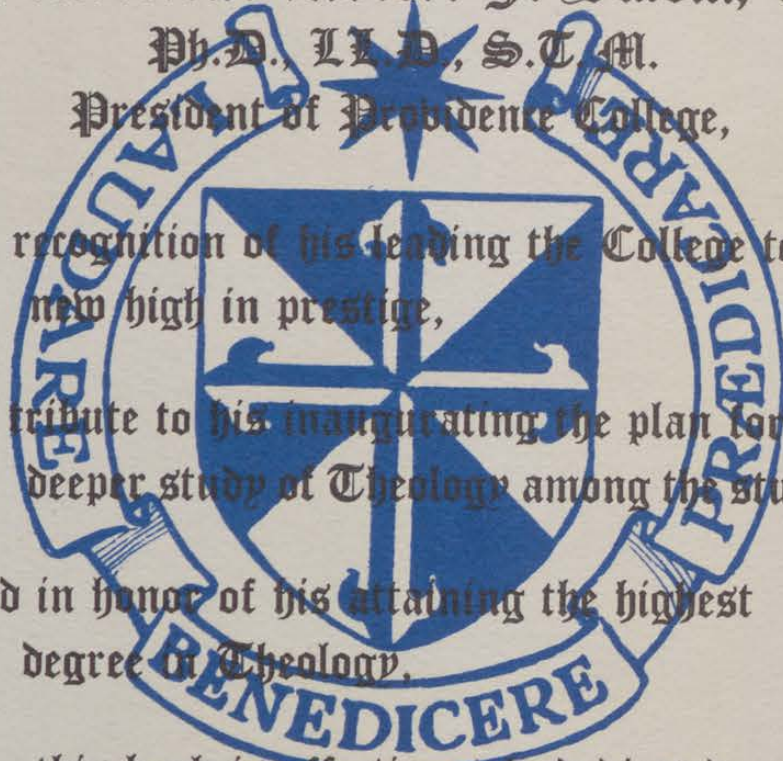

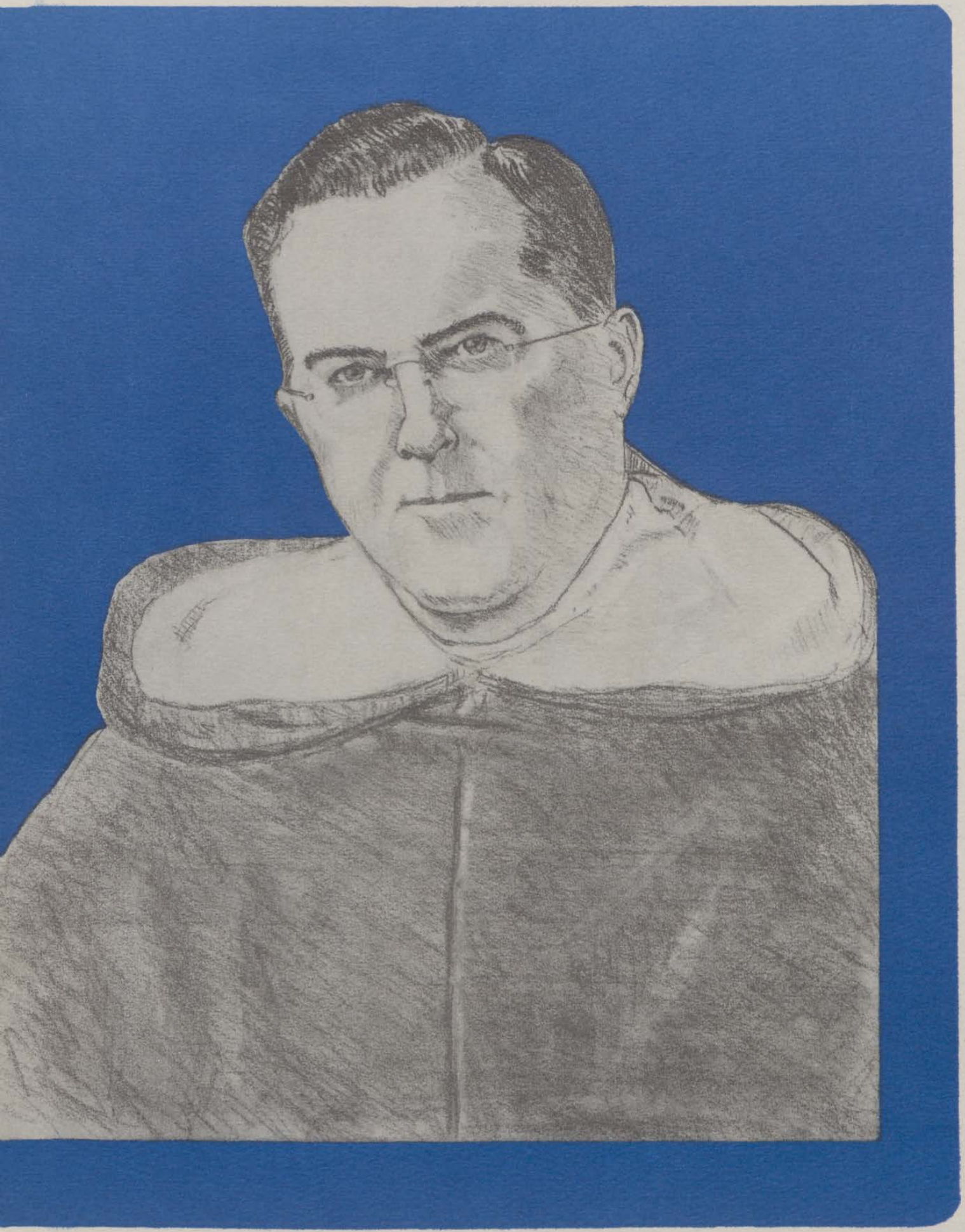

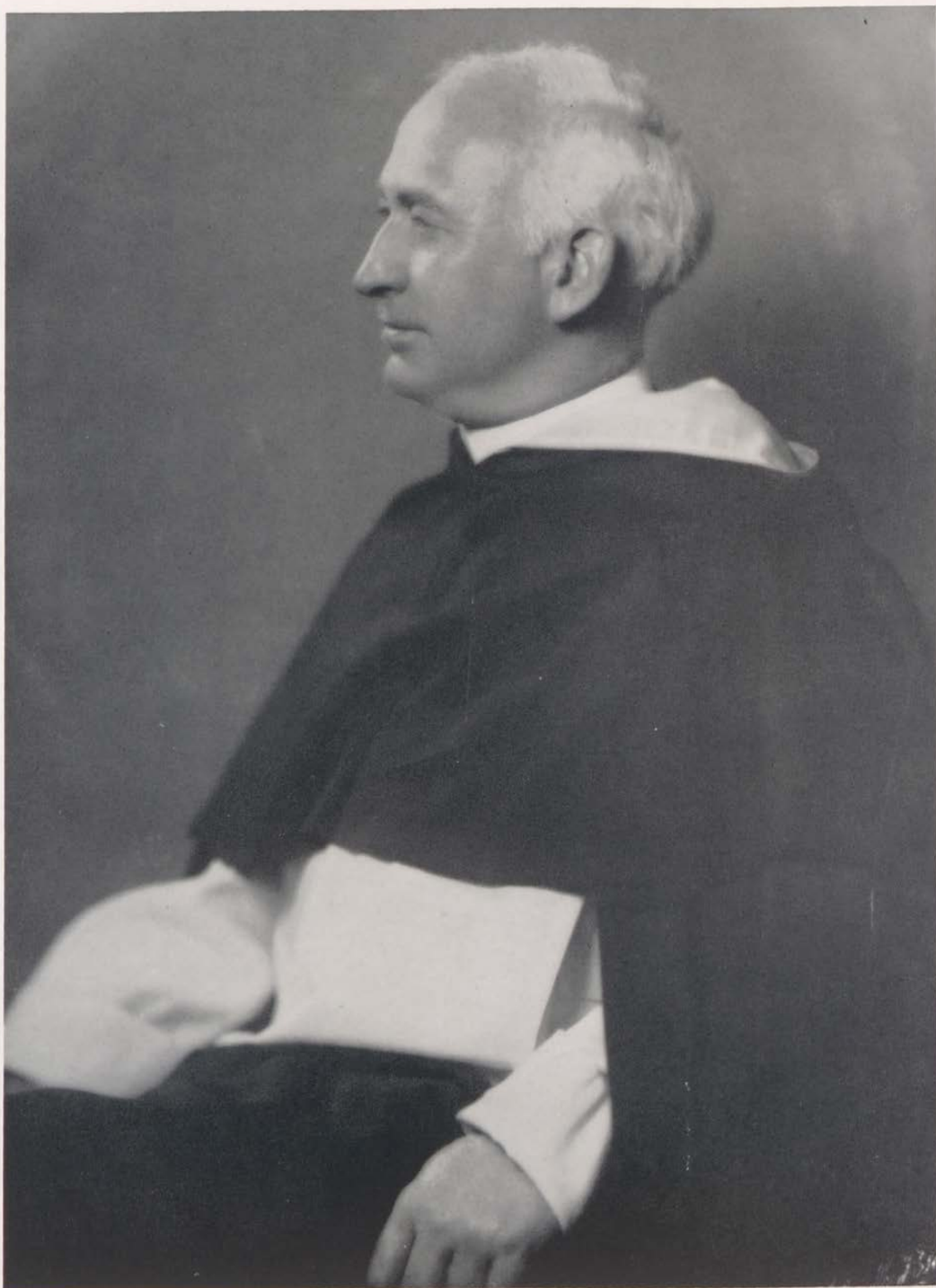

IN the fall of 1916, Matthew Harkins, Bishop of Providence, invited the Dominican Fathers of the Province of St. Joseph to establish a college within the diocese. Permission was received in February 1917 from the Master General of the order "to establish a house to educate youth in religion and letters." The charter for the college was granted by the state of Rhode Island in the January session of the state legislature of 1917.

At the first meeting of the corporation, held on March 10, 1917, the executive committee was authorized to proceed with the construction of a suitable college building. Formal dedication of this building, *Harkins Hall*, named for its patron, Bishop Harkins, was delayed by World War I, and did not take place until May 25, 1919. Ten years later, because of the rapid growth of the college, a wing was added to the rear of Harkins Hall and was dedicated by Bishop Hickey on February 7, 1929.

The original site was enlarged in 1926 by the purchase of the adjoining Bradley estate. A wing was added to the family mansion already located on this land, and it was named *Guzman Hall*, from the family name of St. Dominic (1170-1222), founder of the order. This building became the living quarters for the Dominican pre-ecclesiastical students. Also part of the Bradley estate was *St. Thomas House*, which now provides living quarters for members of the faculty.

*Hendricken Field* was dedicated and first used on Armistice Day of 1922. It was named for the first Bishop of Providence, Thomas Hendricken.

In 1937 was begun a residence hall designed to bring together the out-of-state students living off-campus. This building, *Aquinas Hall*, was formally dedicated on the Feast of St. Thomas, March 7, 1940.

The influx of students after V-J day caused the corporation to decide upon the enlargement of the physical facilities of the college. Their plans resulted in the building of *St. Antoninus*, *Donnelly*, and *Albertus Magnus Halls*.

The first of these structures, which houses the classrooms, offices, and laboratories used in the business courses, was named after St. Antoninus, (1389-1459), a noted Dominican economist.

*Donnelly Hall*, commemorating John Donnelly, college superintendent of grounds for more than 25 years, was designed to hold both students and members of the faculty. However, it now serves as a supply center for the college ROTC, provides offices for the school publications, and living quarters for some members of the faculty.

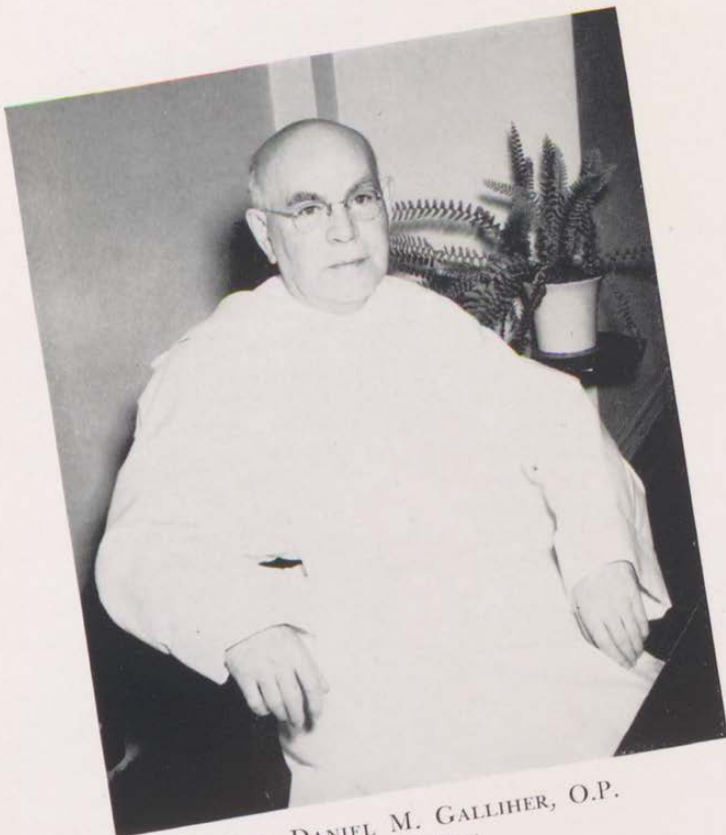
In 1948, the cornerstone of *Albertus Magnus Hall*, the new science building, was laid by the Master-General of the Dominican Order, the Most Reverend Emmanuel Suarez, O.P. *Albertus Magnus* contains classrooms, laboratories, offices, an auditorium, and the college radio station. This building was named after St. Albertus Magnus (1193-1280).

*The Grotto of Our Lady of the Rosary* is a living testimony to the memory of the sixty-nine sons of Providence College who died in World War II. Constructed of native fieldstone, it was erected in 1947.

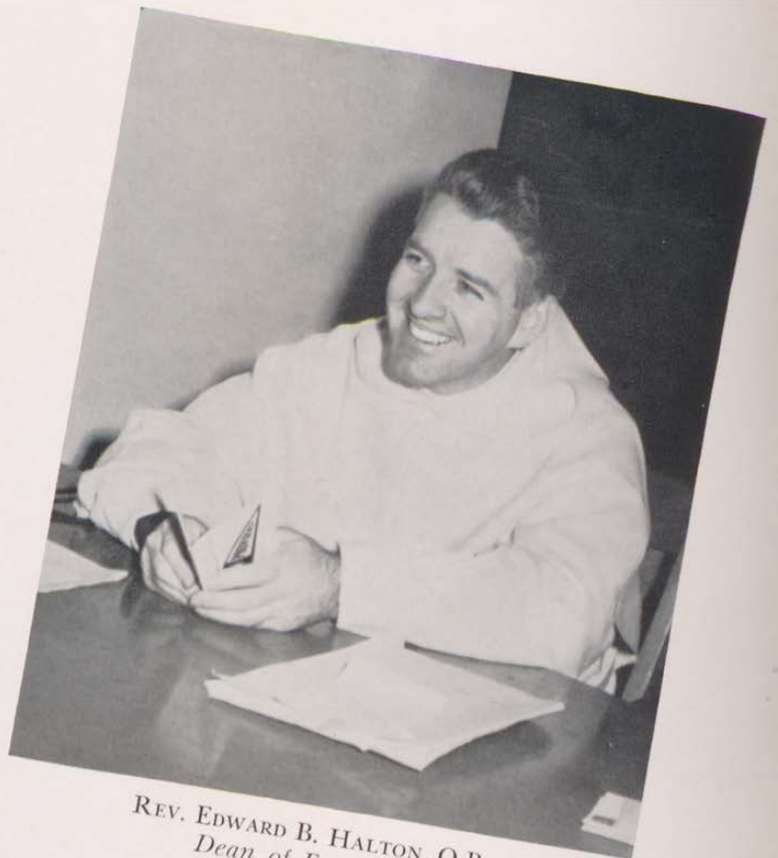

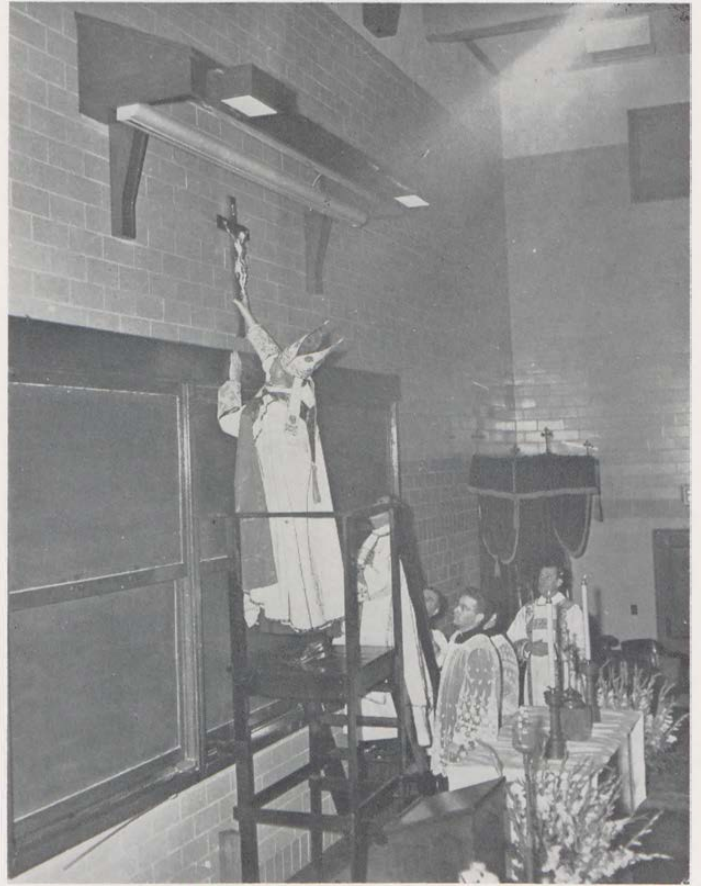
## FRESHMAN YEAR

In his official greeting that fall, the Very Rev. Robert J. Slavin, O.P., president of the college, struck the keynote of the coming four academic years with the words, "We pray to the patron of learning, St. Thomas, that he will beseech Almighty God to bestow upon our student body the virtues of studiousness and docility." Philosophy was included in the Freshman curriculum for the first time in the college history, and the study of St. Thomas' *Summa Theologica* was made a four year course. Another first was marked when the policy of presenting lectures by well known national and international speakers was introduced. Among the many prominent literary and ecclesiastical figures to so visit the college was Seumas MacManus, renowned Irish story teller, Arnold Lunn, British author and convert, and the Rev. John S. Kennedy, Catholic literary critic and editor.

A constitution for a Student Congress was proposed by Father Slavin and accepted by the classes. The Freshmen, in their first fling at politics elected John Cassidy, president; Robert F. Connelly, vice president; Paul Bernier, secretary; and William McCaughy, treasurer. The administration added a new office, the Placement Bureau, and appointed Maurice J. Timlin, a member of

the Business Administration Department, as director. One of the outstanding events of the year was the Penny Sale held to defray the expenses of the construction of the War Memorial Grotto. Its success was due to the combined efforts of the college chaplain, the Rev. Charles McKenna, and of the entire student body, who sold chance books for several months. This combined with the sale of raffle tickets to the estimated 12,000 people that mobbed the R. I. Auditorium, served to raise \$55,000.

It was a lean winter for basketball, the varsity winning nine out of twenty-six games, but the freshmen group promised better things with a record of 16-4. In the spring the Friar nine gave baseball enthusiasts something to shout about, with victories over Holy Cross, Villanova, R. I. State, and Brown, despite a losing record of 7-9. The track team, youngest of the athletic organizations at P. C., progressed by leaps and bounds under Harry Coates' expert hand. Harry, indeed, brought the college national recognition in the sport in March, when the first invitation outdoor track meet attracted athletes like Andy Stanfield, Herb McKinley, Phil Thigpen, Sam Felton, Hank Dreyer, and Charley Salde.

Socially, the Freshman class had its first bid at the Host's role with the Freshmen Mardi Gras, of which Dan Casey was chairman. Over 200 couples who all seemed to be enjoying themselves, filled Harkins Hall auditorium and the class wrote its first social venture into the books as a success. The Friars Formal, the Carolan Club "Dorm Weekend", and the Forty-Niners dance were highlights of the winter social season. While the main attraction, the Junior Prom, was held to the rhythmic strains of Ray Eberle's orchestra.



## SOPHOMORE YEAR

The academic year opened with the traditional Mass of the Holy Ghost, celebrated by the Very Rev. Russell J. McVinney, Bishop of Providence. A few weeks later P. C. helped swell the multitudinous gathering of more than 55,000 who attended the Holy Name Hour at Narragansett Park. Students and faculty members observed the visit of the Pilgrim Virgin of Fatima with a Marian Holy Hour and an all night vigil. In January the Rev. William R. Clark, O.P., of the Sociology faculty drew together the married students on campus at the Family Holy Hour. Later that year when fire gutted the Cistercian Abbey at Cumberland, undergraduates helped clear the debris. Commencement activities were overlaid with a pall of sadness, as both faculty and students grieved over the sudden death of the Rev. J. T. Fitzgerald. Father "Fitz" had been a professor at P. C. since its beginning, and for the past nineteen years had served as vice president of the college.

In the sophomore elections that fall, John Triggs gained the office of president, and Robert Murray, Walter Faulkner, and Robert Connelly, the offices of vice president, secretary, and treasurer.

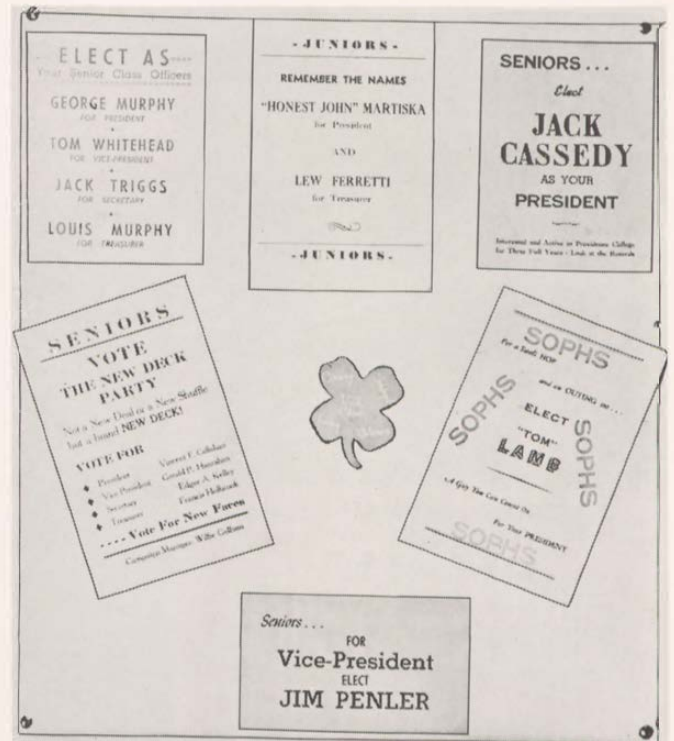
Several men, prominent in the worlds of business and education paid visits to the college. R.C.A. president, Frank Folsom offered encouragement to business students as regards opportunities in commerce, during a talk sponsored by the Ship and Scales Club. An interesting lecture on Irish Culture was presented by Dr. Richard J. Hayes, librarian of the National Library of Dublin. The address to the graduates on Commencement Day was delivered by Dr. Henry M. Wriston, president of Brown University and the American Association of Universities.

The class of 1952 began to take a larger part in extra-curricular activities that spring. The Pyramid Players, student dramatic society, stole a march with the memorably funny three act comedy, *The Milky Way*. Debating flourished with the increased activity of the Barristers, who won recognition in a series of intercollegiate debates and scored at several national tournaments. John O'Donnel of the class of '52 was elected president of the organization.

Sports had become important on the campus that year and thus Father Slavin instituted an Advisory Athletic Council to coordinate their ever increasing activities.

The council consisted of alumni, faculty members, and a student representative. Vin Cuddy replaced Larry Drew as varsity basketball coach, and one of his star pupils, Jim Schlimm, set a new P. C. scoring record, sending 342 points through the hoops. The greatest sports thrill of the year, or perhaps of any year, came, however, when the basketball squad scored an astounding and dramatic 59-57 upset over a highly favored R. I. State team. A last second set shot by Walt Lowzowski turned the R. I. Auditorium into pandemonium, as jubilant P. C. students uninhibitedly celebrated their first court victory over the Rams in ten years. Both indoor and outdoor track teams displayed remarkable proficiency considering the short period of time that had elapsed since their inception. The Coatesmen captured the K. of C. one mile relay in Boston, and placed a solid third in the NEAAU indoor championship meet. In contrast, the baseball team had its worst season in years, winning only three games and losing twelve.

A well attended Sophomore Hop, under the chairmanship of Arthur Gloster, opened the song and dance season at P. C. Jimmy O'Neil's Collegiate Band provided the accompaniment for the Farmers Festival, and the Friars Formal was held amid the usual Christmas decorations. The social season reached a climax with the presentation of Art Mooney and his famous orchestra at the Junior Prom.

## JUNIOR YEAR

An old fashioned election campaign led off the junior year. In the hotly fought contest, which was marked by rallies, parades, and promises, the class of 1952 elected Robert Connelly president by a scant eighteen votes. George Murphy, William Bunting, and William MacMahon filled the offices of vice president, secretary, and treasurer, respectively. More than 1300 students signed

Over the summer other officers and enlisted men arrived, a combination rifle range and garage was established on the north campus, and preparations were made to assimilate the freshmen and sophomores who were to comprise the corps.

The opening of school began organization, with students taking physicals, being measured for uniforms, and receiving their textbooks. Instruction consisted of three hours of class room a week, with an additional hour and a half of outdoor drill in good weather, in which members of the advanced unit provided officers for the battalion.

Besides the regular work of the unit they have also organized a military band under the direction of the Rev. Irving Georges, O. P., a rifle team, a drill team, a club for model railroad enthusiasts, and a society for the cadet officers.

## Veridames

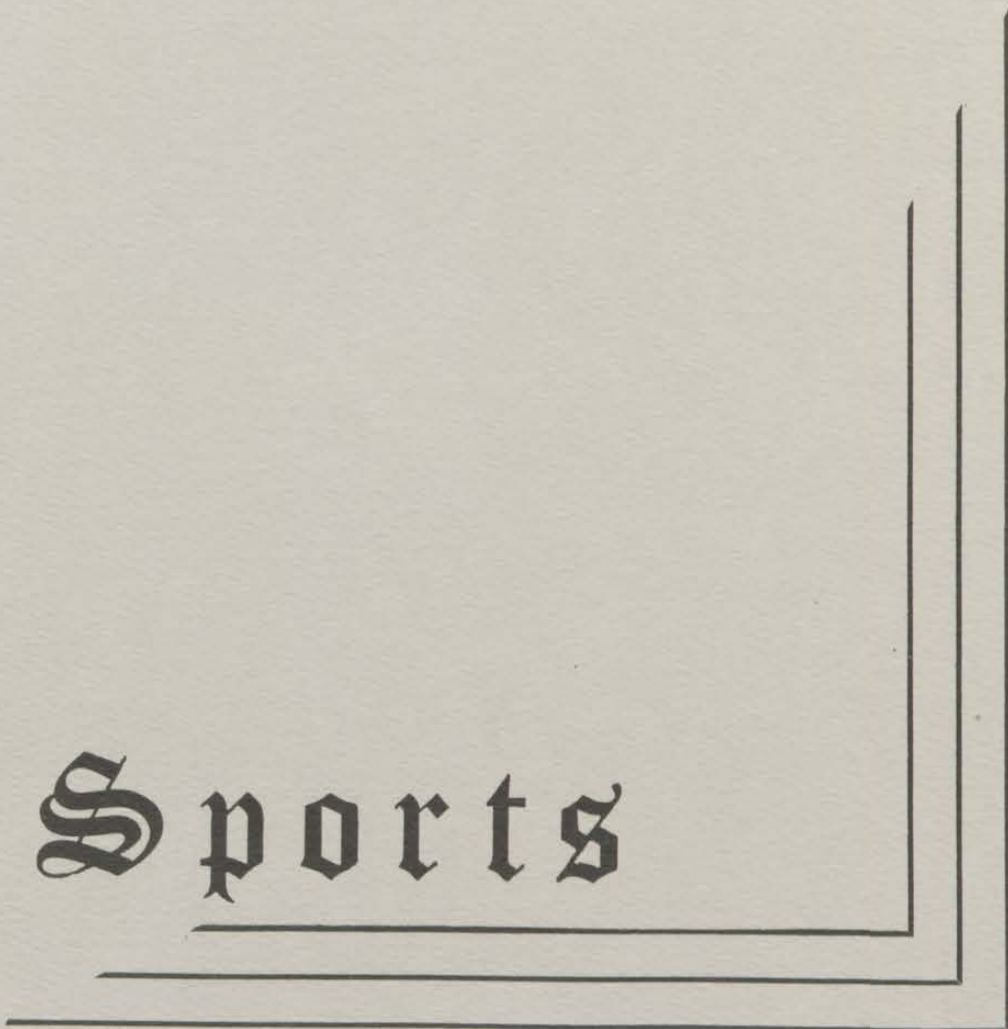

Watch that curve ball!

In 1951 Providence College undertook its most ambitious and far-flung baseball campaign since the pre-war era. The Friars had a schedule of twenty-two games and made a Southern tour for the first time in the school's history. Their opposition consisted of major varsity opponents both in New England and in the South.

The season opened up down South on April 18th with Mt. St. Mary's College of Emmitsburg, Maryland furnishing the opposition to the fireballing right-handed Bill Mullins.

Mullins overpowered the home forces for a 9-1 Friar victory fanning nine men and walking only three. He permitted only two hits over the eight innings and was in command all the way. The Friars played errorless ball in the field and the timely hitting of Bill Quinn, who gathered three of Providence's thirteen hits, proved to be too much for the St. Mary's nine to cope with.

On the following day the Quantico Marines provided the opposition for the forces of Hal Martin and thanks to a four-run first inning rally and sparkling relief pitching by curve-balling Ed Sullivan, Providence College triumphed 4-2 in a game called at the end of seven innings due to darkness.

Despite a fine pitching performance by the crafty left-hander, Bill McKeon, the Friars dropped their first game of the young 1951 season by a 5-4 score to Hampden-Sydney of Virginia. A scratch single off McKeon's glove in the ninth inning sent the winning run scurrying in from third base.

The University of Virginia was the next stop for the Friars of Providence College and the home forces eked out a 3-2 decision over the Friars. The Friars' two runs resulted from Don MacDonald's prodigious home run with Sam Nissel on base via a walk in the fourth inning. Virginia tied matters at 2-all in the sixth inning and finally won out in what proved to be the fatal tenth.

A return engagement with the Quantico Marines next confronted the Friars, and erratic play afield contributed heavily to a 7-3 victory for the Marines over the Friars. Buzz Barry, who banged out three base hits, and Dick Duignan, who banged out two bingles, were the only shining lights among the Friars.

A tough Georgetown nine offered the next opposition for the weary Friars, and all in all, it was no contest after the first few innings. Ed Sullivan drew the nod from Coach Hal Martin, but due to bad support in the field and the lack of his usual stuff, Ed didn't even work up a sweat. His successors on the slab proved equally ineffective and the final result was a 14-4 pounding for the Friars.

The last stop on the Southern trip was Brooklyn's Dexter Park where the Friars met, what in pre-season calculations, was supposed to be one of St. John's University's stronger clubs. Lefty Bill McKeon drew the starting assignment and responded with a brilliantly pitched 5-2 victory over the home forces.







Well done, Powers

The Friars must have forgotten to bring along their press clippings as they showed utter disregard for a highly rated Yale team by humbling them by a score of 5-2. The game wasn't as close as the score indicates as Bill Mullins, the pride of the P. C. pitching staff, held Yale hitless for six innings and it wasn't until the eighth inning that the Elis tallied.

The biggest Friar offensive show of the season was manufactured at the expense of Massachusetts Institute of Technology when the Providence forces overwhelmed the Cambridge nine by a 16-6 count. The Friars smashed out eighteen hits for a total of thirty-two bases including circuit smashes by MacDonald (his third of the campaign), Duignan and Quinn. MacDonald and Duignan also rapped out triples while Quinn socked a double and a pair of singles to accompany his circuit smash.

May 5th marked Providence College's first home appearance after nine games on the road. The Aces of American International College of Springfield, Massachusetts provided the opposition and at the end of the fracas it all added up to a sad home coming day for the friars as they bowed to the Aces by a score of 6-3. The Friars

only managed to gather six hits with only one of them doing any damage and that was a 360-foot homer by "Beaver" Power in the third inning with two mates aboard accounting for all the Friar runs.

A bases loaded triple to deep left center field by Mike Roarke, and the six-hit pitching of Bill Scholz proved to be too much for the Friars to cope with as they bowed to Boston College by a 7-2 score. Bill Mullins, the Friar starting pitcher, had control trouble as shown by his eight walks, but he received poor support in the field. He gave up six of the Boston College seven runs on five hits before being relieved for a pinch hitter in the seventh. The relief ace of the Friars, Ed Sullivan, followed Mullins to the slab and gave up the last Boston run.

The Rhode Island State Rams, who were leading the race for the State Intercollegiate baseball crown with two victories in three games, now invaded Hendricken Field as P. C.'s first intra-state foe. Rocco Negris was selected to do the Rhode Island State chucking, while Coach Hal Martin chose Bill McKeon to oppose him. Negris was successful in beating McKeon in a thrilling 7-6 Ram victory.

Providence College's journey to Worcester proved to be a fatal one from a Friar standpoint as the Holy Cross Crusaders behind the seven-hit pitching of southpaw Dick Bogdan, downed the Friars by a 4-2 count.

Next in line was an engagement with St. John's University at Hendricken Field, and in this contest the Friars once again downed the forces from Brooklyn, this time by a 15-5 score. Sophomore Bill Gallagher, who had been bothered all spring by a sore arm, made his first start for the Friars and gave up all the visitors' runs before being lifted by Coach Hal Martin in the fifth inning for a pinch hitter. Bill McKeon, who had gained a decision over the Redmen in the earlier portion of the season, once again showed his mastery over them in a brilliant relief stint during which he blanked them over the last four frames.

The next club to visit the confines of Hendricken Field were the forces of Brown, and P. C. lost its second intra-state game to the visitors by an 8-5 score. Dave Traynor, Brown sophomore left-hander, had a no-hitter going for 6 and 2/3 innings, but he weakened considerably in the closing frames and was pounded by the Friars for eight hits, but the rally was a little on the late side.

A disastrous first inning, in which Providence College committed three errors and the Gymnasts of Springfield College pounded out three hits, all added up to five runs and thus gave Spring-

field the decision over the Friars by a 6-2 count. Bill Mullins started for the Friars and pitched six-hit ball, but due to the poor support in the field and the fact that the home forces could only touch the Springfield fast-baller, Bill Nordberg, for five hits, he lost a comparatively well-pitched ball game.

Ed Sullivan, sophomore relief pitcher of the Friars, turned in a neat bit of relief pitching for one and a third innings and this coupled with a three-run tenth inning rally gave the Friars a hard earned victory over Boston College by a 7-4 score, thus avenging an earlier season loss to the Eagles. In the tenth inning Sullivan singled and scored what proved to be the winning run on Dick Duignan's single. After a hit batsman, Sam Nissel's line single to center field gave P. C. two more insurance runs.

Providence College's baseball team managed to gather only two hits off Springfield College pitcher Fran Nevers, but both came in the eighth inning and provided the Friars with a 1-0 victory over the Gymnasts in a squeaker. This victory snapped an eight-game winning streak for the Gymnasts and provided the Friars with a very impressive win as well as avenging an earlier season loss to the same club.

Providence College Alumni Day, which always marks the end of the Friar baseball schedule, was celebrated by an 11-4 victory for the home forces over the Crusaders of Holy Cross. Bill Mullins, bespectacled fast-baller, hurled the Friars to this win as the home forces as a unit turned in one of their most impressive performances of the year.

On March 17, 1951, the third annual Providence College Invitation Track Meet was held on Hendricken Field. Providence College played host to a large field of colleges and high schools, including: Seton Hall, St. Francis, and Iona College. Seton Hall University gained the team victory, collecting a total of 16 points. St. Francis was second with 8 points and P. C. third with 6 points. In the Eastern Catholic Championship events, Bill Welch of St. Francis won the mile run. Don Shanks of Seton Hall was second, and Bill Sherry of P. C. was third. The winner's time was 4:30.4. The Championship 50-yard dash was won by Casey of St. Francis in 5.5 seconds. Currotta of Seton Hall was second and Penler of P. C. was third. The Freshman medley relay

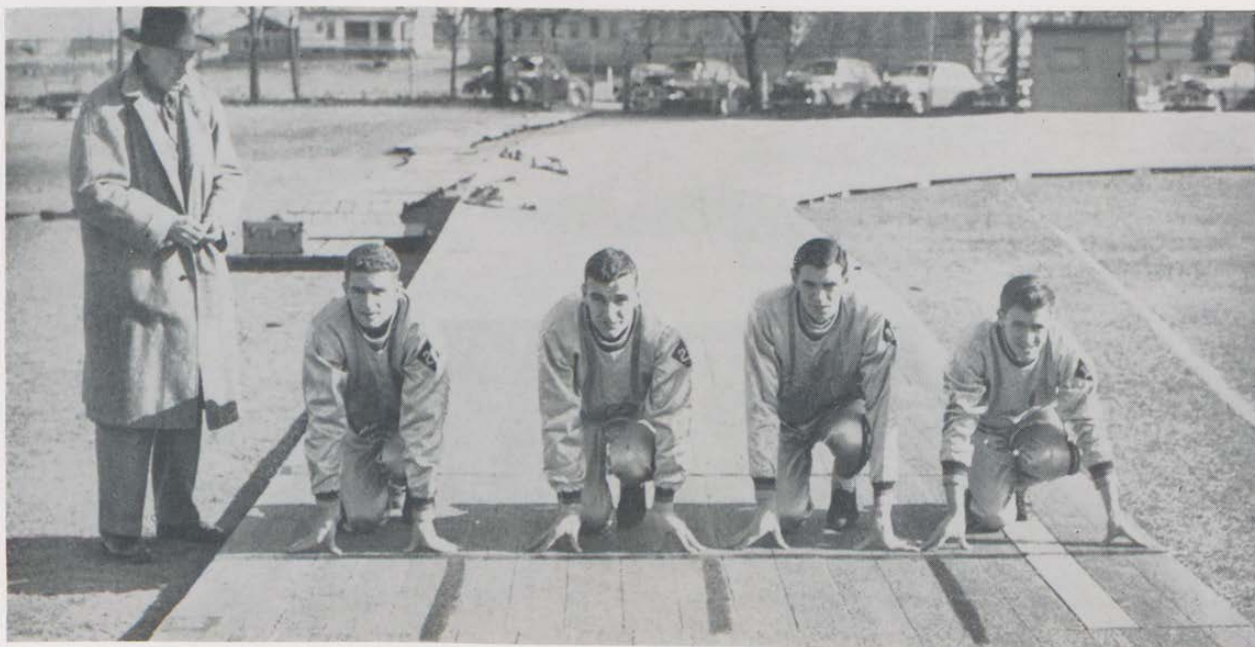
(Eastern Catholic Championship) was won by Providence College (Lohner, Dugas, Corvese, Newman) in the time of 7:58.9.

On April 14, 1951, the Friars commenced their outdoor season on the cinders when they succumbed to the University of Rhode Island's overwhelming superiority in the field events and lost the meet, 84-51. Outscored 55-8 in the field events, the Friars outpointed the Rams 43-29 in the nine running events.

At the Seton Hall Relays on April 20, 1951, the relay teams were entered in three Eastern Catholic Championship races. In the 2½ mile medley relay, the Providence College team of Cassidy, Lussier, Johnson, and Sherry defeated Seton Hall by twenty yards in 10:37.4. Johnson and Sherry combined with Jim Gannon and Bob Tiernan to defeat Seton Hall in the two mile relay in the time of 7:59.2. In the third event the P. C. mile relay team of Penler, Lussier, Tiernan, and Cassidy was nosed out by St. Francis for second place. The Seton Hall team won the race in 3:22.8. April 21, at Seton Hall, in a sectional race, the mile relay team defeated Adelphi, La Salle College, and Fairleigh Dickinson in 3:26.6.

April 21, at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia, the relay teams had high hopes, but it simply wasn't their day—the teams failed to place.

The Friars returned to dual meets on May 2 when the team traveled to Worcester to duel with Holy Cross. Again the Friars lack of depth, especially in the field events proved to be their nemesis as the Crusaders won, 75½ to 50½. On May 9, the Friars were beaten by Brown, 83-51. Again, as in the previous meets, the lack of depth proved to be the team's downfall.

In the 440-yard run, Bob Tiernan won in the best time of his career, 49.5 seconds—which was  $\frac{1}{5}$  of a second off the meet record. The Friars third winner was Jerry Alexander who won the javelin throw with his best toss ever. The distance was 197 feet, 11 inches.

The 1951 outdoor season came to a close for P. C. at the New Englands on May 19 at Springfield, Mass. Five Friar trackmen were entered and all qualified. Only Bob Tiernan, second in the 440-yard run and Jerry Alexander, second in the javelin throw placed.

The Cross Country season opened Oct. 6, at Franklin Park in Boston, Mass. with the Friars dueling the Boston College harriers. The team gained an easy win over the Eagles, 17-46. Dick Lee led the Friars home in 22 minutes, 23 seconds.

On Oct. 16, the P. C. harriers engaged the Springfield College team on Hendricken Field. The Gymnasts' Hillmen were the first to cross the finish line; but P. C.'s fine depth prevailed with the team taking the next five places and emerging victorious, 20-44.

On Oct. 19, the Friars played host to the University of Rhode Island on the Providence College course. In an exciting race the Dominican forces prevailed, 26-30. Lister of R. I. won the race in 22 minutes, 30 seconds but P. C.'s depth and a fine sprint by Chris Lohner who set back the Ram's fourth and fifth men enabled P. C. to come out on top.

The final home meet of the season found the Friar harriers tangling with Holy Cross on Oct. 26. The team had an easy time in beating the Crusaders, 15-40, with Dick Johnson first crossing the finish line.

On November 1, at Franklin Park in Boston, Mass., the second annual Eastern Catholic Cross-Country championship run was held with Providence College playing host to a field of four schools. Besides P. C., Seton Hall, Iona, and Lemoyne vied for the first leg of the Bishop McVinney Trophy. The Friar hill and dalers recorded a first in Providence College athletic history as they became the first P. C. cross-country team to win in a championship hill and dale event. Chris Lohner, sophomore star from Irvington, N. J., ran a fine race through the mud and rain for a well deserved victory. The team scores were: first, P. C. 28; second, Seton Hall 49; third, Iona 64; fourth, Lemoyne 95.

On November 5, the Friars defeated Brown on the Bruin course, 20-40, to win the mythical Rhode Island championship. Although Brown's outstanding runner, Walter Molineaux, won the race, P. C.'s well balanced team proved too strong for the Bruins. "Pop" Johnson, in second place led the Friars home. Co-favored with the strong Boston University team the Friars ran into their first bad day of the year and had to be satisfied with third place in the New Englands on Nov. 11. Some consolation was awarded the Friars as Freshman Bill Horridge out-distanced a strong field to win in the Frosh race in the time, 16:36.8, for the three mile course.

The P. C. cross-country season came to an end on Nov. 19, with the running of the I.C.4A Cross-Country Championship at Van Courtlandt Park in New York. In the varsity race the Friars finished fifteenth in a field of over forty teams.

Despite disappointments suffered late in the season this was a team we can well be proud of. Undefeated in dual competition, Eastern Catholic Champs, and Rhode Island champs is a splendid record—evidence of the ability of Coach Harry Coates and the courage and will of the boys to win.

The Friars opened their indoor season on January 5th at the Brooklyn Knights of Columbus meet in Brooklyn, New York. The P. C. mile relay team was one of the five teams out of thirty-five entered to qualify for the finals. The quartet of Dick Tiernan, Jack Cassedy, Frank Lussier and Bob Tiernan finished fourth against some of the finest relay teams in the country. Manhattan College won the final in the speedy time of 3:19 minutes. Fordham was second, N. Y. U was third and the Friars were fourth. Last year's mile relay champion, Seton Hall, was fifth. The Coatesmen's time was 3:22.5 but Providence College had a forty-yard handicap as did Fordham and N. Y. U.

On January 12th the mile and two mile relay teams represented Providence College at the Evening Star Meet in Washington, D. C. The mile relay combo of Dick Tiernan, Paul Methia, Frank Lussier and Bob Tiernan defeated the University of Virginia, Richmond University, and LaSalle. The winning time was 3:32.2. The two mile team was victorious over LaSalle, Virginia Tech, and St. Joseph's of Philadelphia. Carrying the baton for P. C. in this race were Chris Lohner, Dick Johnson, Lussier and Bob Tiernan.

January 19th found the P. C. Tracksters running nearer to the home base in the Knights of Columbus Meet in the Boston Garden. The mile relay team won its race, handily defeating Brown, Boston University and Maine. The quartet of Dick Tiernan, Methia, Cassedy and Jim Penler was clocked in 3:27.9. In the two mile relay the P. C. team of Johnson, Lussier, Lohner, and Bob Tiernan finished a close second to Yale. The race with the Bulldogs was a renewal of a rivalry which started during the 1951 indoor season.

January 26th the mile relayers traveled to New York for the running of the Millrose A. A. Games. Good fortune was not with the Friars, however, and they finished last in a field of fine teams.

February 2nd, back in Boston again, for the Boston A. A. Meet, the P. C. mile relay team won its race against Holy Cross, Brown and M. I. T. The time, 3:24 was the team's best of the season. The two mile team finished fifth in a race which Yale won. In the Jack Ryder 440 Yard Run, Jack Cassedy placed third behind O'Leary of B. U. (second) and McCreary of Dart-

mouth (first). The winner's time was 51:5 seconds. Bob Tiernan of P. C. finished third in the William J. Bingham 880 Yard Run. The race was won by Walter Molineaux of Brown in 1:59. Participation in both these events was by invitation.

At the New York A. C. Meet on February 9th the P. C. mile relay team avenged a previous defeat by Holy Cross in the Millrose Games by beating the Crusaders in what turned out to be a match race. The team of Methia, Cassedy, Lussier and Dick Tiernan was clocked in a fast 3:25.

February 23rd at the I. C. 4-A Championship in New York the mile relay team competed against the best in the country. In an afternoon trial heat the Coatesmen were defeated by Colgate and Seton Hall and failed to qualify. Columbia and N. Y. U. were fourth and fifth in the same heat. In the Freshman Medley Relay the P. C. yearlings finished fifth in a ten team field. Slocum, Methia, Martin and Horridge carried the Friar banner with Horridge outstanding in the anchor leg over the mile distance.

March 1st the Providence College 1952 indoor season came to its conclusion at the Knights of Columbus Meet in New York. To say the least the competition was tough. In the qualifying heat the mile relay team finished third, behind Colgate and Syracuse. The strength of these two teams was indicated by the fact that Colgate and Syracuse finished two-three behind Manhattan in the finals. The team of John McMullen, Frank Lussier, Paul Methia and Bob Tiernan was timed at a highly respectable 3:25. Frank Lussier, the first father in the history of P. C. trackdom, ran one of the finest quarters of his career, 49.8 seconds.

Early in March the Athletic Department announced the decision to suspend plans for the annual P. C. Invitation Board Track Meet because of the difficulty in securing a suitable date. It is hoped that this event will be held in 1953 for all P. C. looks forward to this splendid meet.

Heartly congratulations are in order for Coach Harry Coates and all the members of the track squad who have given the followers of Providence College sports so many thrills in such a short period of time. May the future hold bigger and better things for the wearers of the spiked shoe.

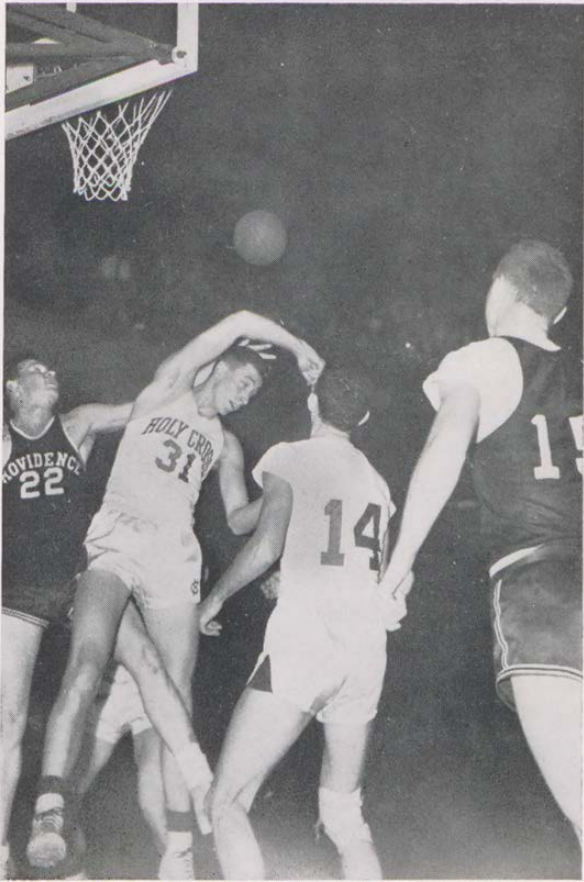

Just before exams P. C. engaged St. Anselm's and brought home a 57-54 victory. With Moran again leading the way the Friars had to go all out in order to extend our season's record to 8 victories.

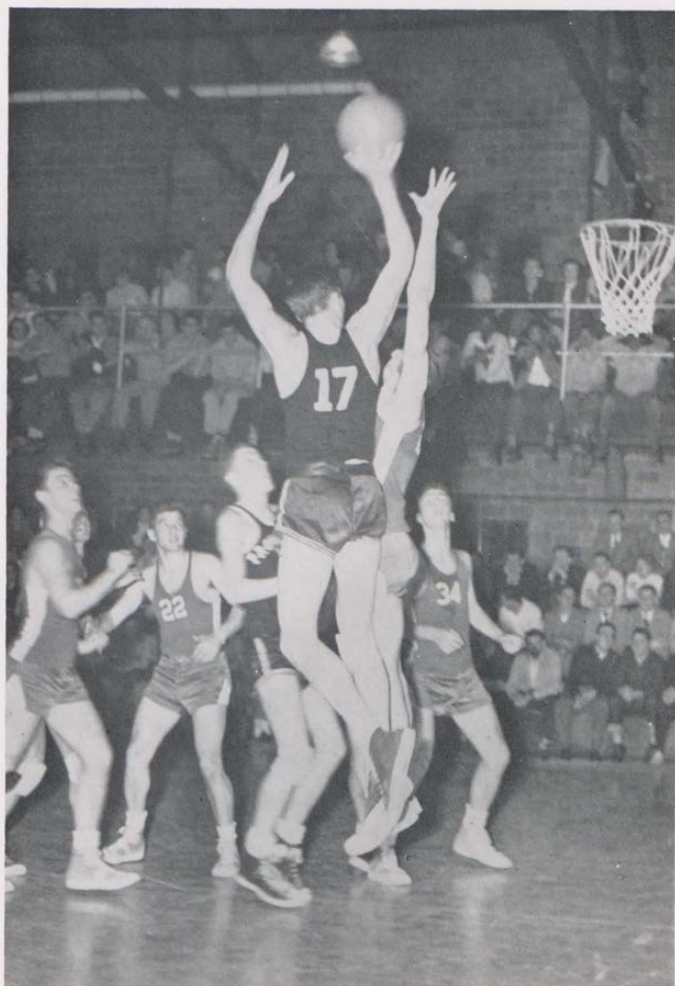

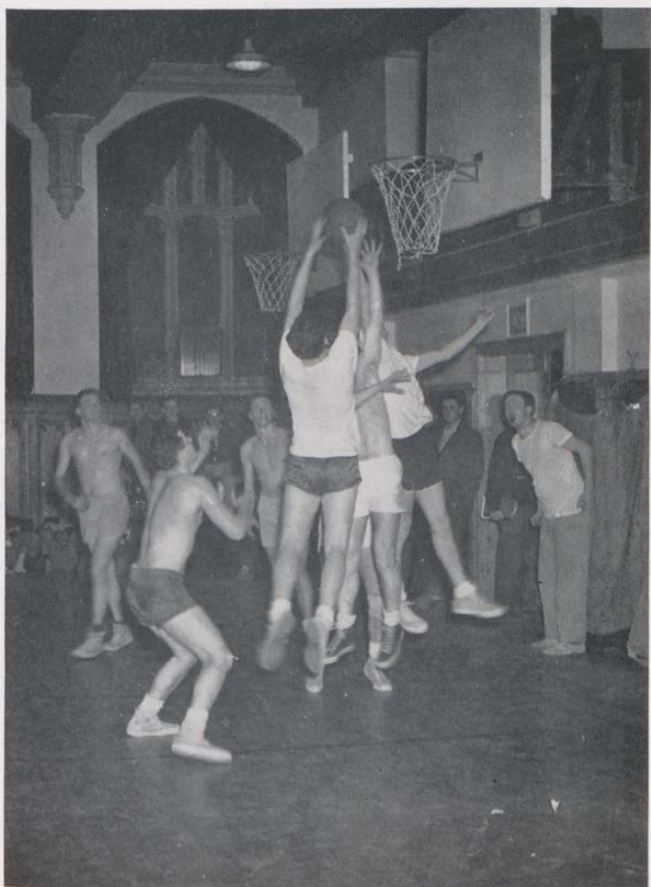

the Crusade for Freedom Scroll, and forty-four juniors were nominated for membership in the Theta chapter of Delta Epsilon Sigma, national catholic honor society.

The experiment of theater in the round inaugurated a very active season for the Players. Excerpts from Galsworthy's *Escape?* and O'Casey's *Juno and the Paycock* were presented in the student lounge before a capacity audience, and similar productions met with like success. In early May, the players presented an original student musical. *Guys 'n' Ivy* was written, acted, and staged, entirely by P. C. students; and, it enjoyed a delightful three night run.

The Basketball team once again upset a favored R. I. State team, this time going into overtime to turn the trick, 68-67. With a season of 14-10, the Friar five entered the New England NAIB Tournament and emerged victorious. This resulted in a trip to Kansas City for the national tournament, where the Cuddymen were eliminated in their first contest. In addition to the big year in basketball, the track team carved for itself a permanent place in Friar sports history by copping three relay races at the Seton Hall Relays, and winning the AAU Junior Mile Relay championship, against big time opposition. Another losing record of 9-11 failed to indicate the true ability of the baseball team, which defeated such strong opponents as Yale, Holy Cross, Boston College, and St. John's.

The Glee Club undertook an ambitious program, and accomplished it with a great deal of success. One of its feature concerts was a joint concert with the Glee Clubs of New Rochelle and Fairfield in the Grand Ballroom of the Waldorf Astoria in New York. To climax its season, a concert was presented over the NBC New England Network, sponsored by the Monsanto Chemical Company.

The Junior Prom was, as always, the focal point of the social season. The Prom Committee, headed by Robert McElhiney and Louis Seminare, engaged the services of Charlie Spivak, and presented, in the opinion of many students the most pleasant and enjoyable prom in years.

### SENIOR YEAR

With an admonition from the Bishop to avoid the pitfalls of mediocrity, the Class of 1952 began the final leg of its journey.

One of the most important events of the year was the formation of an ROTC Motor Transportation unit at

the college, in which were enrolled 502 Freshmen and Sophomores. Colonel Roy P. Moss assumed command of the unit, and a staff of officers and non-coms was appointed to assist him. In conjunction with the ROTC, a military band was organized, under the direction of Rev. Irving I. Georges, O.P., to play for drills and inspections.

During the first semester, the school was grieved over the deaths of the Rev. John J. Kennedy, O.P., a former philosophy professor and dean at the college, and of the Rev. Walter Farrell, O.P., whose *Companion to the Summa* had been used by so many students to acquire the fundamentals of Catholic Theology. On the other hand, however, the entire student body and faculty shared in the honor of the conferring of the Master of Sacred Theology, highest of all ecclesiastical degrees, on our president, Father Slavin.

George Murphy, senior presidential candidate, and his entire party, Thomas Whitehead, vice-president; Louis Murphy, Secretary; and John Triggs, treasurer, swept to an overwhelming victory in the class elections.

Students, in a survey conducted by the *Cowl*, picked Eisenhower as the man best qualified to head the government.

With an ever expanding program, the Glee Club was once again given the opportunity to sing over the NBC New England Network, by the Monsanto Chemical Company.

The fall sport season saw the cross country team occupying the limelight in winning the Eastern Catholic Cross Country Championship in Boston, and collecting victories in several dual meets. Vin Cuddy's hoopsters, strengthened by the addition of some very promising freshman, gave indications of becoming one of the finest teams ever to represent the school.

The real history of the class of 1952, as we have already stated, will not be found on these pages, but in the minds and hearts of the men who lived it. Under the influence of Catholic doctrine all the aspects of their college life have been integrated and directed towards a common goal, the acquisition of eternal happiness. Now they begin the most important phase of their mortal tenure. Wherever they may turn, God grant that the principles and standards of Catholic morality received at Providence College may remain with them forever.

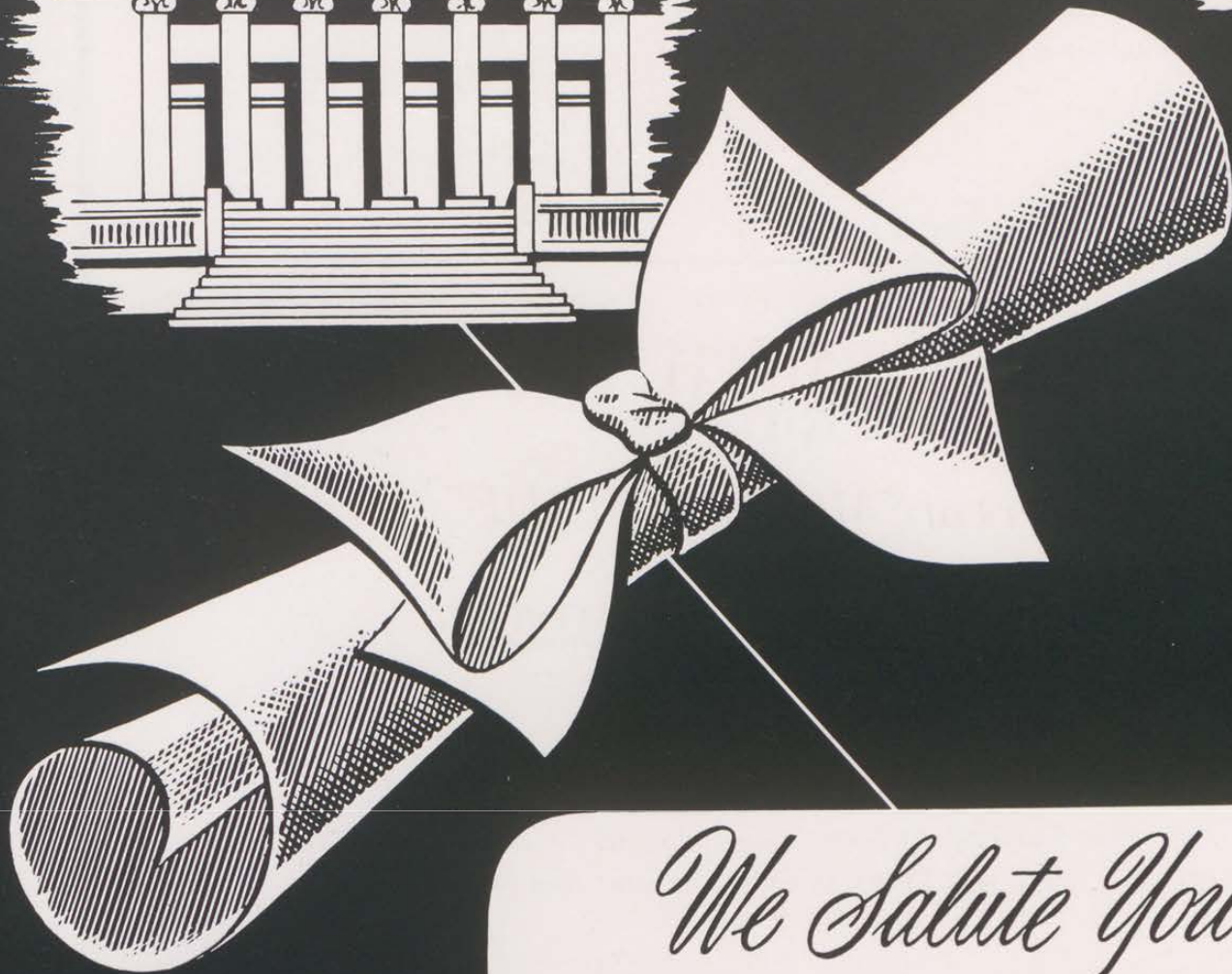
